Coaches Will Sacrifice

We have been talking for several weeks now about the Samaritan's Feet Project. We are now actively engaged with this project. You have received, via email, a letter that you can send out to family and friends asking for donations to help put shoes on 400 kid's feet. Our goal is to raise \$6,000. That is with every player in the league raising only \$50.

To help keep us engaged with this until the end of the year all of our MBA Coaches have agreed to coach their games on Saturday, February 16 in their bare feet.

It would be great if you could invite some of your family and friends that you are asking to donate money to come and see how our coaches are making a physical sacrifice to help promote this event. If they see our coaches coaching in their bare feet it might help them in their decision to make a donation.

When I asked the coaches to do this I got some interesting feed back. There was some hesitation at first and even some negotiating. A couple of guys asked if they do it in their socks. One asked if they could do it for just a half. As I listened to all the requests, questions and negotiations going on I finally said, "Gentlemen, you are making my case for doing this even stronger. I am asking you to coach for one hour with no shoes on a surface that is pretty flat and stable. It is indoors with no rocks to step on, and no holes to step in to maybe turn an ankle."

Think of those who have no choice and have to go all day with no shoes. They have to walk on rocky, uneven surfaces that causes great pain with each step they take. They walk outside on dirty, dusty surfaces that do great harm to their feet. It did not take long for everyone to agree to do this for their one hour game.

Registration to Begin on March 2 for Next Year

Believe it or not, it is time to begin registration for next year. On March 2 we will open the online registration and you can secure a spot for next year by registering now. We will offer an Early Bird discount by registering in the month of March.

If you register between March 2 and March 31 you will receive a \$20 discount. Instead of the normal \$195 fee you will pay only \$175. If you want to save some money for next year and assure that you have a confirmed spot, take advantage of the Early Bird Discount.

There is a multi-child discount of \$15. If you have more than one child living in the same house, then the second child and any other after that will get a \$15 discount. They would pay \$180 instead of the \$195.

There will be a \$5 Early Bird discount for the second child and beyond if booked in March. Example: First child would pay \$175 (\$20 off the normal \$195) and second child and more would also pay \$175 (\$5 off the already discounted \$180) if booked in March. After

March 31 registration goes to \$195 per player and \$180 for additional siblings in the same house.

Many people in the past wait until summer or early fall to book and find that the spots have been filled and have to go through the waitlist process. Sometimes players have gotten off the waitlist and sometimes they have not. To avoid that, and taking the chance that there might not be a spot, sign up early and put your mind at ease.

Every player will be receiving a pre-printed registration form on March 2. If you want to pay by credit card online you may do so and the pre-printed form will just act as a reminder to register. If you want to pay by check you do not have to register online. You simply return the pre-printed form with any corrections and your check to the MBA Office.



The 24th Annual MBA All Star Game will be on Saturday, March 2 at United. All three Divisions will play that day. The Blue Division will begin at 10 a.m., the White at 12 noon, and the Red at 2 p.m.

Nominations will be turned in by the coaches. Players will be voted on from the nomination list. Every team will have at least one player represented.

There will be a small admission charge for All Star Games. Adults and children over 12 will be \$2. Children 12 and under are free. The \$2 admission fee is good for all three games.

We encourage everyone to attend the All Star Games. They are always exciting to watch and we have great games every year. If you are a Blue or White Division player stay and watch the other Divisions and

see what you have to look forward to. Players who do not make this All Star team are encouraged to come and watch the games as well. Hopefully sometime in the future, with continued hard work and practice, you may be playing in one of these games. It is a great goal to have.

If your child is selected to play in the All Star Game you will be notified by the Coach concerning a one time practice and what team they are on. We will also post the player's names in the gym no later than February 23.

We look forward to three great games and a lot of support for these players. Bring your family and friends to this exciting event.

New Developmental League to Start Next Year

The Board of Directors has been tossing around an idea for awhile and are ready to make an announcement. Our next MBA Basketball Season will see a new Developmental League for first, second and third graders.

Here are some details about the League:

- 1. It will begin the first Saturday in December and go until March. The first four weeks will be practice/clinic time to learn the fundamentals of the game. They will learn how to dribble, pass and shoot. They will learn positions on the floor and some basketball terminology.
- 2. After four weeks of practice they will play an eight game schedule.
- 3. We will have a boys division and a girls division.

- 4. We will place eight kids on a team and there will be guaranteed playing time.
- 5. There will be a Parent/Kid game at the end of the season.

We will have some more details and a flier with all of the details and the cost very soon for you to see. We hope that those of you with younger children will want to get them started now to develop their skills to continue playing in the MBA through the 8th grade. If you can get eight years in this program, your child will have developed some pretty good skills, not only in basketball, but some life skills as well.

- All families will receive an email from the MBA this week through Constant Contact. Please be sure to open any mail you get from the MBA
- 2. There will be an attachment. Please open it. It will be an email letter you can send out to as many family and friends as you want explaining the program and asking them if they would be willing to make a donation in any amount. There will be a link at the bottom of the email for them to click if they are willing to make a donation.
- 3. For you to make a donation you can go to the MBA website and look for the link on the Home page and click on it.
- 4. If you, or any of your potential donors, don't want to make a donation online, you can write a check to the MBA and write Samaritan's Feet in the memo line. Send it to the MBA Office and we will deposit the checks and the MBA will do the online donation for you from the MBA account.

5. We want to raise \$6,000 for this project. Samaritan's Feet will be able to purchase 400 pair of new shoes and socks for 400 needy kids. If every family (120) was able to collect only \$50 in donations from their network of family and friends, we would attain our goal. When many give a little, great things can be done.

When you send out your emails, include your team name so the donors can write your child's name and the team name in the comment section so we can see who the donors are sponsoring. We hope to see every players name on that list. We will keep this open until March 25, 2013. There is a Goal Thermometer on the MBA Donation page. You can track our progress and see how we are doing.

Again, this is a great way to get your kids involved by asking them to send an email to their family and friends to help **THEM** help others by making a donation in any amount.
