Last-second heroics pace Runnin Rebels
Austin Luke scored 17 points, but it was his last two assists that paced the Runnin Rebels past the San Antonio Celtics, 76-74.

Luke connected with Derrick Davis for two layups in the final 22 seconds - including the game-winner with two seconds remaining - to aid the Runnin Rebels in earning a spot in the quarterfinals. The plays also helped the Runnin Rebels erase a 43-35 halftime deficit.

The teams were tied at 72 with 1:37 remaining. Luke made a nice pass to Davis with 21.8 seconds left to give the Runnin Rebels a two-point edge. The Celtics' Griffin McHone tied the game with a driving layup with 10 seconds left, but the Luke-Davis connection hooked up again just before the buzzer, giving the Runnin Rebels the victory.

Chase Davis finished the game with 26 points, and Davis had 20 for the Runnin Rebels. Davis drained five 3-pointers in the win. Cale Brubaker finished with 25 points and nailed seven 3-pointers. Ronnie Vanlandingham added 13 for the Celtics.

# Mustangs advance, get revenge

The Dallas Mustangs-Booker defeated the Texas Tigers Elite, 79-69, to advance to the quarterfinals. The Mustangs' first-round game, however, may have been more memorable.

The Mustangs defeated Islanders Basketball Foundation, 69-44, in their first bracket-play game and erased the frustration of GASO play two years ago. IBF beat the Mustangs twice during the summer of 2010 in separate NCAA Division championship games.

The Mustangs advanced to the quarterfinals late Sunday by holding off a scrappy Tigers team. The Mustangs led the Tigers by 12 at the half and cruised in the second half. Soma Edo scored a gamehigh 20 points, while Jeffrey Carroll and Leyton Hammonds each had 15 for the Mustangs.

Sterling Holmes and Sam Burmeister combined for 33 points to lead the Tigers.

Tim Priller, at 6-foot-8, had 16 points and made four 3-pointers for Metro Elite. Daniel Jackson led ATX Lockdown with 14 points and also made four 3-pointers. Daniel Mills and Isaac Gilliam combined for 23 points for ATX Lockdown.

## Gold tops Black in Triumph Select battle


