I am thrilled to inform you that each young man with a 4.0 GPA will be taken out to dinner courtesy of Dr. Joseph Cerimele, our team physician.

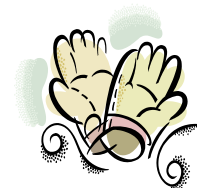
