Federal Way Orange 33, Puyallup Vikings 0

The Federal Way Orange 89ers faced another new opponent the Puyallup Vikings. After a few miscues, one being a muffed punt, the other a fumble on offense, the Hawks settled down and took it to the Vikings 33-0.

The defense once again had a dominate game, forcing four turnovers. Running the Wishbone on the second offense series seemed to be the spark to get the Hawks rolling #25 Ronald Davis gained 11 yards on the first play. Then #10 Joshua Pearce broke through and ran 31 yards for the touchdown. Davis added the extra point to make the score 7-0. Then one play after the kickoff, the Hawks had the ball again. Sparked by an opening run by #24 Isaiah Erickson of 12 yards and Pearce for 13 yards the Hawks would score two plays later and add the point to make the score 14-0. This time it was Davis who scored the touchdown. Federal Way's offense then attempted to pass on their next drive, but only completed 1 of 5.

Then the Special Teams stepped up when #1 Niko Contoravdis took the second half kickoff 63 yards behind a wall of blockers. Davis scored the extra point to make the score 21-0. Coach Swanson then turned to his bench, which didn't do to shabby on the next drive. #6 Marlon McLarty took the handoff and scampered 25 yards for the touchdown. The Hawks then tried to kick the extra point, but the kick didn't quite make it. The bench then continued to be impressive, finishing the game with one more score, an 11-yard run by #7 Nasir King.

Ronald Davis led the Hawks this week with 62 yards on nine carries and a touchdown. Pearce had another impressive game gaining 60 yards on six carries and touchdown as well. McLarty contributed 45 yards on two carries and a touchdown. #7 Nasir King finished the day with 45 yards on six carries.

Pearce led the defense with 4 1/2 tackles and two fumble recoveries. #3 Halleston McGuire had an impressive 3 tackles off the bench. #23 M. Cade and #12 Jaylen Thomas each contributed 2 1/2 tackles and each had a fumble recovery. Davis had two tackles. #1 Niko Contoravdis had 1 1/2 tackles. #2 Alijah Bogan and #13 Jesus Otero finished the day with a tackle apiece.

The Federal Way Hawks 89ers, who are 5-0, will now take on the Bethel Braves on Saturday, at home. Good luck Hawks!!!

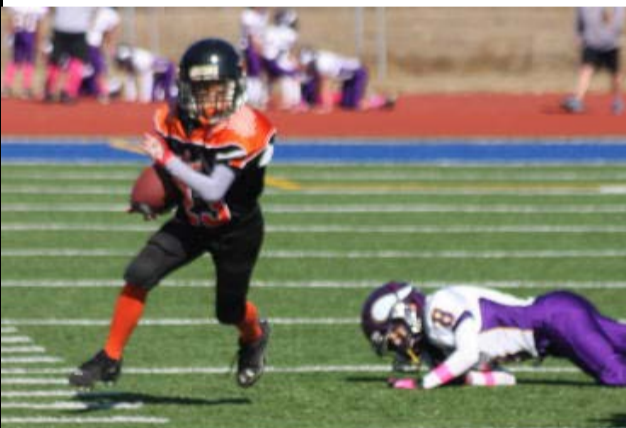
