Irondequoit tops Aquinas in 1-2 matchup

There has been a rebirth of a hockey program in Section V this season.

Well, two rebirths actually. The old is again new as former perennial powers Irondequoit and Aquinas are once again piling up the victories — and sectional seeding points. Just as the predecessors in their programs did one, two, three and four decades ago.

And when they met on Monday afternoon at Lakeshore Ice Arena, Irondequoit posted a 5-2 victory, allowing them to carry away bragging rights right down Ling Road following the showdown of New York State's top-ranked Division 2 teams.

Anthony Thurston scored two goals — the first and the last — and Connor Hynes set up two and scored the game-winner as the top-rated Eagles improved to 11-1 overall and 5-0 in league play.

Their trophy case devoid of the sectional hardware since 2001, the Eagles have been determined to make a statement on the ice this season.

"It's good to get the Irondequoit winning tradition back," Hynes said. "It reflects how we've been playing and how we've been practicing."

“How we prepare, that's a maturity thing,” coach Jim Hofford said. “We have to be ready at the start, we can't spot a team two goals and expect to

win.

“But our focus from the start of the year has been, ‘Let's win the last game.’”

Indeed, winning in January is nice, but trophies are awarded in February and March, as alumni from both schools know very well.

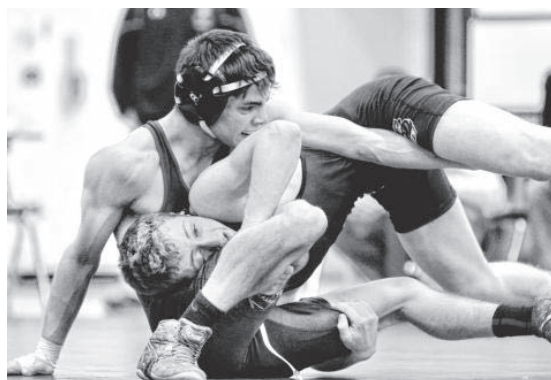
