- · Color mixing and theory information
- · Water consistency and Usage of Light
- · Atmosphere and mood
- · Visual language in Watercolor

Workshop Outline

1. Understanding of Shapes and Plains

- Simplifies the shapes (dark/light patterns on objects).
- Color mixing and water consistency
- Connect the lights and darks and their relationships

2. Creating Atmosphere and Mood

- Mood relationship to the light situation
- Practice with three situations-soft/hazy, medium and sharp bright
- Using edges, color values and colors to support mood

3. Texture and depiction as part of design

- Wet on wet technique
- Dry on wet

4. Watercolor Languages

- The simplicity of the brush works
- Dry brush on motion
- Pull the detail elements together to unified painting
