
Bailey Wade waited for a set from one of her teammates and, once she received it, the Amherst standout delivered a brutal kill — one with all the deep, rumbling pop of a volleyball being severely mistreated.

On the adjacent court, William Campbell's Rachel Hansen did the same thing, producing a devastating shot that had no chance of being returned. A few minutes later, her teammate, Holy Cross sophomore Nicole Leal made a diving stab, keeping the ball alive and giving her team another point. Leal leapt quickly to her feet, a broad smile growing across her face.

These are common scenes at Sandusky Middle School, where Central Virginia Volleyball's recreation program is in full swing. There are other sightings, too: Mishandled passes, dropped return attempts and serves that don't quite make it over the net. It's OK, though, because this is recreation; a time when one betters herself, bonds with teammates and prepares for the high school season, which is only a few months away.

There are other clubs around Lynchburg, like U-Turn and Won By One. Some of the girls taking part in recreation play for these clubs when the high school season ends and for a girl who wants to play in college, participating in club ball is a must.

The CVVB rec program has grown every year since beginning more than a decade ago. In 2013, for example, 26 teams took part in the spring program. This year, rec director Ben Taylor said 32 teams are registered and 321 girls, ages 8-18, are competing. CVVB has also added a boys league this year.

Roughly half of the girls are in or entering high school. Recreation gives coaches and athletes a chance to see the competition well before the season begins.

For instance, Amherst squared off against Brookville on Thursday. Heritage played a combined team from Holy Cross and William Campbell.

Hansen, who also plays tennis in Naruna, is in her fifth year of volleyball.

"I use this as practice before school conditioning starts," she said.

Hannah Montgomery, a tall freshman from Virginia Episcopal, said she's attracted to the sport because of the team atmosphere.


"In rec league, you get the opportunity to try different things," she said. "If you're working on a new serve, rec league is a great time to figure out if you'll be able to use it in a game."

Rustburg's Bree Statesman watches the competition closely. She'll remember her opponents when the high school season arrives and especially when conference play signals the start of postseason.

"I'm trying to get back in the swing of things and get the chemistry back with my teammates," she added.

Kirsti Pounci played JV volleyball for Brookville last year and even made a varsity appearance during her school's postseason run. She also joined HOV's U15 National team this past season. For a squad that lost seven seniors, she knows Brookville will reload in 2014. So, she's focusing on learning new skills now.

"You don't always have to play your position," she said of rec volleyball. "You can play other positions and learn different skills."

Bryant said local teams also get a chance to breed young talent through the program. For instance, her Heritage team already features standout players like Chyna Carter, Maryah Sandidge and Julia Hicks. Then there's rising freshman Mara Beth Hammersmith, who is playing with her new teammates a little early.

"In the [Virginia High School League], it would be illegal to play an eighth grader," she said, "but here, it's perfectly fine."

Notable players have come through CVVB, including Rustburg's Michelle Heath (William & Mary), Nelson's Ashley Wells and Altavista senior Sydney Morris, who is headed to James Madison University.

Bryant and Hardy both said CVVB is looking to expand by buying or building a new location. Right now, the organization rents gyms at Sandusky and Linkhorne Middle, while holding tournaments at Liberty University or Sweet Briar College.

"We'd like to find something now," Bryant said, "so that we're set up when the travel program starts again."
