This event benefits the "Adam Gott Collegiate Club Lacrosse Player Fee Scholarship," ATG Legacy Project activities, and celebrates the honor, brotherhood, and spirit of the lacrosse community.

The following provides detailed information regarding the Tournament.

Team Check-In:

The <u>Head Coach</u> should plan on reporting to the "Team Check-In" tent at least **1 hour prior** to the start of your first game. At that time, we will verify your team; ensuring that we have received (via the website registration link) from you and your players:

- completed PLAYER registration form (one form per player)
- completed COACH registration (one form per coach)

Head coaches will receive:

- a sheet of helmet stickers for each player that has completed their registration form
 - o each rostered player MUST place a sticker on their helmet
 - o paper copies of the registration form will be on-hand; players & coaches MUST have their valid US Lacrosse membership number in order to participate

There are a variety of locations on campus for you to create a "home base" for your team. We will NOT provide security and these areas. Leave valuables behind at your own risk.

Players, coaches, fans, and visitors will NOT have access to the school or Fieldhouse. Outdoor restroom facilities are available.

Silent Auction

1st Aid Tent

The 1st Aid Tent will be located next to the Tournament Check-In tent (see site map). Medical professionals will be on hand for the evaluation and treatment of injuries and sudden illnesses of players, fans, and volunteers. Maplewood EMS has been notified of our event and we expect a quick response time, if necessary.

If you have a player with a chronic medical condition (diabetes, asthma, bee sting allergy, etc.) and they carry rescue medications, we encourage you to have those players **report to the 1**st **Aid tent upon their arrival**. We will note their team and field locations during the tournament in an effort to quickly respond to their needs in the event of an emergency related to their medical condition.

The 1st Aid Tent will be equipped with an AED, water, and standard first aid supplies.

State guidelines with regard to the symptoms, evaluation, and return to play for concussion will be enforced during the Tournament.

Tournament Rules

Game play will follow NFHS rules with the following amendments:

- 12 minute running time quarters
- 2 minutes between quarters
- 5 minute half time
- 1 time out per game/team (1 minute)
- No horns
- Penalty time served is 100%
- A player ejected from a game for an USC, will not be able to participate in the next game
 - o A player ejected from 2 games will NOT be able to participate in the remainder of the Tournament
- All pool play ties will stand
- The Championship game will be played out in the event of a tie in regulation
 - o 4 minute running time OT
 - o no time outs

***If two teams have the same record at the end of pool play, seeding for playoff games will be determined by:

- 1. head to head
- 2. points against
- 3. point differential (however, the differential will max out with 4 goals)
- 4. coin toss

Two officials are scheduled for each game with two scorekeepers assigned to each table. Water will be available at each game field for the teams throughout the Tournament.

Inclement Weather

Games will be played rain or shine. However, should inclement weather arise the officials and site manager will make a decision with regard to suspending play. In the event of a sudden weather emergency, we will seek shelter inside the Hill-Murray Field House.

US Lacrosse Foundation - Keeper of Lacrosse Project

The US Lacrosse Foundation, Keeper of Lacrosse Project has taken a special interest in the Gott to Lax Tournament. They are providing us with a Keeper of Lacrosse wooden stick to award to one tournament player who best demonstrates the values of the Keeper project throughout the Tournament.

Officials will nominate players following each game. We will collect the nomination forms at the end of pool play to identify the winner. The winner will be announced on Sunday.
