He then turned the ball over to Bryce Schneider for the 7th, and Schneider slammed the door, not allowing any runs. At the plate, the Timberwolves totaled 7 hits as a team. Kyle McClure led all players with 3 hits. Hudson Cuevas had 2 hits, his first being a huge 2-RBI triple in the 1st inning. The Timberwolves went on to win Game 1 by a score of 3-1.



The JV Silver battled in both games this week against Glenn but were unable to earn a win going 0-1-1 on the week.


On Tuesday night the team battled hard but couldn't seem to get the bats going and fell 2-0.
