A's advance to Night League Championship with win over W.B. 7up

September 8th - The Kewaskum A's advanced to the Tri-County Night League game championship with a 13-5 win over West Bend 7up on Wednesday night (Sept. 8th). The A's showed no rust offensively as they exploded for seven runs in the decisive first inning. Kurt Zagzebski, Adam Martz, and Jace Unrein collected RBI singles in the inning, while Jim Ziegler, Ty Schill, and Jeremy Bartelt all had RBI doubles. West Bend answered with three runs in the bottom of the 1st to cut the A's lead to 7-3, but the A's were able to hold down West Bend just enough for the win. Jace Unrein 2x6 (2 2B's, 2 RBI's) and Josh Klismith 2x3 led the A's offensively. Jim Ziegler picked up the complete game victory scattering 7 hits and overcoming 6 walks to go along with 13 strikeouts. The A's will look to repeat as Night League champions as they take on Hartford the week of Sept 13th. The A's record improves to 23-21 on the year. For those interested, the Rock River playoffs concluded this past weekend as Brownsville knocked off Oakfield 5-0 to claim their first grand championship.

A's knock off Horicon in Night League playoffs

August 25th - The Kewaskum A's picked up a first round night league victory over the Horicon Honkers by a score of 8-1 Wednesday night (Sept. 1st). Horicon took a 1-0 lead in the 3rd taking advantage of a Kewaskum error in the inning, but it was all Kewaskum after that. The A's put up four runs in the bottom of the 3rd inning when James Goodfellow, Jason Strobel and Kurt Zagzebski all reached base by walks to load the bases for John Cetnar. Cetnar delivered with a RBI infield single to plate the first Kewaksum run and Dan Shea followed with a RBI fielder's choice to give the A's a 2-1 lead. That brought up Jace Unrein who ripped a 2 RBI double down the line putting the A's up 4-1. Strobel and Jim Ziegler provided a little insurance in the later innings as Strobel had RBI singles in the 6th and 8th while Ziegler had a 2 RBI double in the 7th. This proved to be more than enough as Horicon struggled to put together much offense off Kewaskum pitcher Jim Ziegler as he picked up the complete game victory allowing 7 hits to go along with 13 strikeouts.

Slinger too much for A's in regular season finale

August 15th - The Kewaskum A's wrapped up their regular season on Sunday dropping a 15-7 game to Slinger. The A's fell behind quickly in this one as Slinger scored in each of the first five innings in building a 12-1 lead. The lone bright spot early on was an Adam Martz solo home run. The A's eventually got things going in the 6th when Brad Boegel delivered a 2 RBI double to cut the lead to 12-4. Kewaskum was able to load the bases in the 7th with nobody out, but a double play followed that took the wind of the A's sails in the inning. They were able to push across two runs in the inning though making the score 12-6.

With a runner on first in the 8th inning, Boegel again came through as he crushed a double to center to put runners on 2nd and 3rd. Jim Ziegler followed with a RBI single to make it 12-7. A walk to Martz loaded the bases again for Kewaskum, but another double play ended the threat. Slinger went on to tally three runs in the top of the 9th to end any hope the A's had of coming back. Adam Martz led the A's at the plate going 4x4 (HR, RBI), but did pick up the loss on the mound. Brad Boegel chipped in with a 3x5 (2 2B, 2 RBI) day at the plate, while Matt Meisenheimer, [Cody Nurenberg] and Dan Shea all had two hit days. August 4th - The Kewaskum A's picked up a night league victory over Ixonia on Wednesday night by a score of 10-0. Kewaskum jumped ahead with three first inning runs and cruised to the victory from there. Kirk Poss continued his late season emergence on the mound as he threw six shut-out innings before giving way to Josh Woldt, who threw a scoreless 7th. James Goodfellow continued to stay hot at the plate going 3x4 (2B, RBI). Matt Meisenheimer, John Cetnar, and Jace Unrein all chipped in with two hits and a RBI as all A's starters finished with at least one hit. The win puts the A's at 20-20 overall and gives them an 8-2 record in the Tri-County Night league. A's clinch Night League playoff spot with win over Lebanon

August 3rd - The Kewaskum A's locked up a night league playoff spot on Tuesday night by holding off the Lebanon Whitetails by a score of 8-6. The win puts the A's at 7-2 in night league with just one night league game remaining. Kewaskum went to work early putting up a single run in the 1st on a John Cetnar RBI single. Lebanon answered back though with a run in the top of the 2nd to tie the game at 1-1. The A's pushed back ahead in the bottom of the 2nd thanks to a Matt Meisenheimer RBI single, but Lebanon again came right back in their next at bat going ahead 3-2. Kewaskum took the lead for good in the bottom of the 3rd when Jace Unrein delivered a 2 RBI single. Adam Sarauer followed with a RBI fielder's choice to put the A's up 5-3.

The A's were able to add a pair of runs in the 6th on a Kurt Zagzebski RBI single and a Dan Shea RBI double to go up 7-3. August 1st - The A's traveled to Hartford on Sunday still clinging to their small playoff hopes. A win here would keep the A's in contention heading into the final weeks of the regular season, but Hartford would have different thoughts on this day. As the case has been all season, the A's did just enough wrong to find themselves on the wrong side of a 5-4 defeat. The A's wasted a golden opportunity in the 1st as they put two on with nobody out, but were unable to come up with any runs. With the game scoreless in the 3rd, the A's self-destructed allowing Hartford to score four runs on just two hits. Hartford was aided in the inning, but two Kewaskum errors, two walks, a wild pitch and five stolen bases (two of which were successful double steals of home) in building a 4-0 lead.

The A's added a single run in the top of the 4th on a RBI groundout from Adam Sarauer, but gave the run right back in the bottom of the

4th as another error aided the Hartford run. With their playoff chances on the line, the A's clawed back into this one though. Austin Sarauer hit a RBI double in the 5th and also added a RBI sacrifice fly in the 7th as the A's cut the lead to 5-3. Still trailing 5-3 in the 9th Jim Ziegler and Ty Schill came through with one-out singles giving the A's a glimmer of hope. After a strikeout for the second out of the inning, Matt Meisenheimer dropped in a RBI single to make it 5-4. With the tying run at second base and two outs, the A's were unable to come through with the hit they needed and a popout to the infield ended the game and any chance the A's have at the Rock River playoffs. The A's record drops to 18-20 as they have dropped four straight games. They look to rebound this week in Night league action as they take on Lebanon and Ixonia in Brownsville on Tuesday and Wednesday night at 7:30pm.

Kewaskum falls apart late against Oakfield

July 30th - The Kewaskum A's took on Oakfield Friday night in a critical Rock River game for the A's. Playing in a game that featured on-and-off rain showers all game, Oakfield jumped ahead in the top of the 3rd inning plating a single run. The A's wasted little time answering back though as they scored three runs in the bottom of the inning. Kurt Zagzebski worked a bases loaded RBI walk and Jason Strobel grounded into a RBI fielder's choice for the second run of the inning. Adam Sarauer also scored in the inning thanks to a wild pitch giving the A's a 3-1 lead. The untimely defense appeared for the A's again in the 5th though. With two outs and runners on 1st and 3rd, a routine groundball was booted by Kewaskum to extend the Oakfield inning. Oakfield took advantage as they were able to score two more runs in going ahead 4-3.

The A's were still down 4-3 in the bottom of the 7th when Dan Shea led off the inning with a hit-by-pitch. The winner of this game would have the inside track at winning the regular season title and claiming the #1 seed for the playoffs. Kewaskum got on the board first as Austin Sarauer hit a solo home run making it 1-0 A's in the 3rd. West Bend got a single run back in the bottom of the inning though, when an errant throw back to the pitcher allowed a run to score. West Bend took the lead on a two-out infield single in the 6th and tallied single runs in the 7th and 8th to push their lead to 4-1.

The A's wouldn't go quietly in the 9th though as they put together a furious rally. Brad Boegel and Ty Schill led the inning off with walks, and the bases ended up loaded after Matt Meisenheimer reached on an infield single. July 25th - The Kewaskum A's dropped another close Rock River game Sunday to first place Rubicon by a score of 3-1 in 11 innings. The loss puts the A's at 6-6 in the Rock standings and with only 4 league games remaining the A's need to start racking up some wins if they want to make the playoffs. Kewaskum did manage to score first in this game as Dan Shea scored the only A's run in the 2nd thanks to a throwing error on a routine play with two outs by Rubicon. It didn't take long for Kewaskum to return the favor though, as a throwing error with two outs on another routine play also plated the first Rubicon run in the 5th.

Neither team was really able to put together any other scoring opportunities until the 10th when Rubicon put two runners on with just one out. A's starting pitcher, Jim Ziegler, was able to get a groundball double-play to Ty Schill to end the Rubicon threat though. Rubicon wasted little time putting together another rally in the 11th as they put runners on second and third with just one out. Ziegler was able to get a strikeout for the second out of the inning, but a base hit up the middle plated two runs making it 3-1 Rubicon. The Rubicon rightfielder made a great diving catch on the ball for the second out of the inning and fired to second to double up the runner and end the ballgame. It was another disappointing league loss for the A's who have now lost six rock river games but only eight runs. The A's fall to 18-17 on the year as they continue to struggle to find any consistency this season. A season deciding week lies ahead as the A's take on both Oakfield (Friday night in Brownsville) and Hartford (Sunday in Hartford) in Rock River league games.

Kewaskum gets back on track with win over Horicon

July 21st - The Kewaskum A's picked up a Rock River league win Wednesday night over Horicon by a score of 16-1. After sputtering

through three scoreless innings, the A's finally tacked on a single run in the 4th on a Adam Martz RBI double. The A's added another single run in the 5th, this time on a Ty Schill RBI double. The A's finally began to pull away in the 6th when Kurt Zagzebski and Martz led the inning off with singles. Adam Sarauer followed with a 2 RBI double and Jim Ziegler came through with a RBI double after that putting the score at 5-0. With the score at 6-0 in the 8th, [Rob Michalkaewicz] belted a two run homer to right, his first of the year. Jason Strobel followed three batters later with his own two run homer as the A's began to pile it on late. Appleton drew first blood in this one with a solo home run in the 1st inning off Kewaskum starter Josh Stoffel. Appleton was at it again in the 3rd inning as back-to-back singles put two runners on with no one out. With the A's anticipating a bunt, the Appleton #2 hitter crushed a 1-0 pitched to center for a three run homer putting Appleton up 4-0. The A's climbed back though as Kurt Zagzebski got the A's on the board in the bottom of the 4th as he blasted an opposite field home run to cut the lead to 4-1. Jim Ziegler led off the top of the 5th with a double to right and came around to score on another Shane O'Hagan home run as the lead was cut to 4-3.

Appleton answered with a solo homer to start the top of the 6th stretching their lead to 5-3, but the A's fought back again in the bottom of the inning. With two outs, Ty Schill dropped in a single to right and followed that with a steal of second base.
