2012 Rock River All-League Announced

November 11th - The Kewaskum A's were well represented at the annual Rock River banquet last weekend in Hustisford. Receiving Rock River All-League honors were Austin Sarauer (2B) who led the league in homers (5) and finished with 16 RBI's, Dan Shea (OF) who led the lead in hits (26) and finished with 18 RBI's and Jason Strobel (OF). Strobel also took home the MVP as he finished with a .455 Average, 8 2B's, 4 HR's, 16 RBI's in Rock River league play. Lucas Kopeschka (P) and Strobel (OF) also made the Tri-County All-League team. The A's took

home the championships in both leagues (Rock River & Tri-County) this past season, which resulted in Jim Ziegler receiving manager of the year honors.

In addition, the A's front office is already deep into offseason moves as the team looks to compete for another championship next season. The A's would also like to announce their first fundraiser of the year: Bowl for Baseball. This event will take place on January 12th in West Bend.

A's take first game of finals

September 2nd - The Kewaskum A's moved a step closer to winning their first Rock River title, with a 9-2 win over Milton on Saturday afternoon in Kewaskum. Milton threatened in the 1st as a one-out walk and a double to right put runners on 2nd and 3rd, but A's starting pitcher Jim Ziegler was able to wiggle out of the inning without any damage.

The A's struck first plating two runs in the bottom of the 2nd inning. Jason Strobel led off with a single, and came around to score on a throwing error by the pitcher on Brad Young's swinging bunt. Young advanced all the way to third on the play, and was eventually knocked in by Ty Schill as he delivered with a clutch two-out RBI single.

The A's extended their lead to 4-0 in the 5th as Austin Sarauer blasted his ninth home run of the year to right. The A's

gave themselves some additional breathing room in the 6th as Jason Strobel delivered a two-out 2 RBI single to make it 6-0.

Still leading 6-0 in the 8th, Alex Nuelk reached via a single up the middle, and Ty Schill walked to put two runners on for Jake Spaeth. Spaeth put an exclamation point on the day, as he crushed a three-run homer to right to push the A's lead to 9-0. Milton added two runs in the 9th on a two run homer, but the A's hung on for the game one win.

Jim Ziegler (8IP, 0 Runs, 4 Hits, 2 K's) picked up the win on the mound, while Jake Panzer threw the ninth. The A's did strike out 14 times on the day, but made everyone of their eight hits count. Austin Sarauer 2x4 (HR, 2 RBI's), Jason Strobel 2x4 (2 RBI's) and Ty Schill 2x3 (RBI) led the A's offensively on the day.

Rock River Grand Champions!!

September 1st - The Kewaskum A's captured their first Rock River Grand Championship on Sunday afternoon with an 8-0 win over Milton. The win put an exclamation point on a remarkable season for the A's who finished a crazy 41-8 on the season. Great pitching, solid defense and clutch hitting were vital to the A's success all season and the championship game on Sunday proved to be no different.

The A's struck first in this one as veteran's Jason Strobel and Adam Sarauer got things rolling in the 2nd inning. Strobel reached via an infield single to leadoff the inning and advanced to second base on a wild pitch setting the table for Sarauer. Adam put together a solid at-bat and ripped a two-strike pitch through the right side to score Strobel and give the A's a 1-0 lead.

The A's played a little small ball in the 3rd inning to score another run. Jake Spaeth led the inning off with a single, and moved on to second base via a passed ball. Dan Shea and Austin Sarauer then both followed with groundouts to the right side, with Shea's groundout moving Spaeth to third and Sarauer's groundout driving Spaeth in for the A's second run of the game.

With the A's still up 2-0 in the 6th, Strobel reached with a two-out single through the left side to bring up Brad Young. Young delivered with a sinking line drive to center that got past the centerfielder on his attempt to catch the ball. Hustling all the way from first base, Strobel looked like he might score, but a perfect relay throw from shortstop to home cut down Strobel at the plate.

Riding this momentum, Milton put two runners on with one out in the bottom of the 6th and looked like they might score with their number four hitter coming to the plate. Starting and winning pitcher for the A's, Brad Young, was able to get a huge strikeout though, as he dropped in a perfect 2-2 curveball for strike three. The next batter popped out to catcher Alex Nuelk and the Milton threat to score was over.

Kewaskum gave themselves some breathing room in the 7th, when with one out, Alex Nuelk and Ty Schill reached base with back-to-back singles. After a flyout to left by Spaeth, Dan Shea walked to load the bases for Austin Sarauer. After a lengthy at-bat, where Sarauer fouled off numerous two-strike pitches, he eventually got a pitch he could drive and ripped a single through the right side scoring two runs to give the A's a 4-0 lead.

The game was then busted wide open in the 9th as the A's plated four runs on four hits to give themselves a comfortable 8-0 lead heading into the bottom of the 9th. Austin Sarauer and Jason Strobel each had RBI singles in the inning. Milton would not go quietly though as they put runners on 1st and 3rd with one out in the 9th. The A's were able to get just what they needed though, in the form of a groundball double play to end it, and the celebration was on!

Brad Young pitched another gem on the mound, going the entire way to get the shutout. He allowed 9 hits, to go along with 1 walk and 3 strikeouts. Offensively the A's were led by Austin Sarauer 2x5 (4 RBI's), Jake Spaeth 3x4 (2 runs), and Jason Strobel 3x5 (RBI). Ty Schill and Brad Young each chipped in with two hits as well.

As mentioned earlier, the win caps an extraordinary year for the A's. In addition to winning the Rock River championship on Sunday, the A's took home the Tri-County Night League championship, the SWABA Class 'A' championship, the NBC championship and the Plymouth Tourney championship, an incredible resume of championships, unlikely to be duplicated. In addition, this Rock River championship was a long time coming for this team as they have been through just about anything you can imagine on a baseball field over the years. There is no doubt that this makes this championship that much more gratifying.

A's back in Rock River finals with 7-2 win over Hustisford

August 26th - On Sunday, Hustisford got on the board in the 1st, taking advantage of a Kewaskum error to go up 1-0. The A's answered right back in the bottom of the 1st though as Jake Spaeth blasted a leadoff homer to dead center to knot the score at one apiece. A Hustisford error, a walk, and a basehit loaded the bases for Brad Young later in the inning and he came through with a 2 RBI single to put the A's up 3-1. Adam Sarauer followed with a RBI single and it was 4-1 Kewaskum after one complete inning.

The score remained 4-1 into the 5th when Dan Shea led off the inning with a solo homer to left. Two batters later Jason Strobel followed with a solo shot of his own to make it 6-1 A's. Hustisford would get a run back in the top of the 6th, as Jami Kaul blasted a solo homer to rightcenter to make the score 6-2, but that would be as close as Hustisford would get.

Jim Zieglerpicked up the complete game win, while Brad Young 3x5 (2B, 2 RBl's), Adam Sarauer 2x3 (2 RBl's) and Jake Spaeth 2x4 (HR, RBl) led the way offensively. Jason Strobel and Austin Sarauer each chipped in with two hits on the day. The win moves the A's to 39-8 on the year and just two wins away from the elusive Rock River championship.

A's scratch out 3-2 win over Watertown

August 19th - On Sunday the A's traveled to Watertown for their second playoff game of the weekend and came away with a gritty 3-2 win. Watertown jumped on A's starter Brad Young for two runs in the 1st to race ahead to an early 2-0 lead, while offensively the A's saw their first ten batters of the game go down in order. Dan Shea finally got things rolling for the A's as a perfectly placed bloop double got the A's in the hit column. Austin Sarauer followed with a walk and two batters later Jason Strobel connected on a three-run homer to give the A's a 3-2 lead.

The A's would make this lead stand up the rest of the way as Young settled in on the mound pitching seven solid innings to pick up the win. Jim Ziegler tossed the final two innings to pick up the save. The A's were led at the plate by Jason Strobel 1x4 (HR, 3 RBI's), while Ty Schill chipped in with a two hit day. The A's must now wait to find out their playoff opponent for next weekend. In all likelihood the A's will host either Rubicon or Hustisford on Sunday in Kewaskum. There is a chance though that the A's may host Brownsville on Saturday instead. Currently Brownsville trails Milton 4-2 in the top of the 9th, as a loss would eliminate Brownsville from the playoffs, whereas a win sends them to Kewaskum for a game on Saturday. A's pick up win over Madison L.T. on first day of playoffs

August 18th - The Kewaskum A's picked up a 9-4 win over Madison L.T. on the first day of the Rock River playoffs Saturday. Kurt Zagzebski got the A's on the board in the bottom of the 3rd with a grand slam and Dan Shea followed an inning later with a two-run homer to push the A's lead to 6-0. This was enough run support for Jim Ziegler who tossed eight solid innings for the win (6 Hits, HBP, ER, 5 K's). The A's were led offesively by Austin Sarauer 3x4 (2B, BB, RBI), Dan Shea 2x4 (HR, 2 RBI's) and Kurt Zagzebski 1x5 (Grand Slam, 4 RBI's). Jake Panzer chipped in with two hits as well on the day.

A's claim SWABA Class 'A' Championship

August 14th - The Kewaskum A's brought home their first SWABA Class 'A' championship with a 12-4 win over West Bend 7up on Tuesday night. The A's got on the board right away in the 1st inning with a Kurt Zagzebski RBI single, while Brad Young pushed the lead to 3-0 in the 2nd inning with a 2 RBI double to right.

West Bend 7up got a run back in the 4th as former Athletic Matt Parrent blasted a solo homer, but the A's tallied four runs in the 5th to go up 7-1 and never looked back from there. Jason Strobel ripped a RBI double in the inning, while Alex Nuelk had a clutch two-out 2 RBI single back up the middle.

Brad Young continued to shine on the mound as he tossed eight solid innings (6 Hits, 3 ER, 6 K's) to pick up his 10th win of the year. Jake Panzer tossed a scoreless 9th. Ty Schill, Jason Strobel, Kurt Zagzebski and Jake Panzer all had two hit nights for the A's.

A's rebound with 12-2 win over Horicon

August 13th - The Kewaskum A's rebounded from their first Rock River loss Sunday, with a 12-2 (8 innings) win over Horicon on Monday night to conclude the Rock River regular season. The A's jumped ahead right away in the 1st as Kurt Zagzebski rpped a 2 RBI double to get the visitors on the board early. The A's were at it again in the top of the 2nd as a two-out walk to Kevin Gonring got things rolling. Ty Schill followed with a single and Brad Young followed with a RBI single to make it 3-0. Austin Sarauer then delivered a RBI double down the rightfield line to make it 4-0 Kewaskum.

Staked out to the early lead, starting and winning pitcher Lucas Kopeschka was able to settle in nicely picking up his eighth win of the season. Kopeschka tossed seven innings, and did not allow his first hit until the 6th inning. He allowed just two hits, along with two unearned runs on the night. Tate Schill tossed a scoreless 8th inning to finish off the game.

The A's blew the game open in the middle innings thanks in part to Dan Shea, who blasted a three run homer and Austin Sarauer who connected on a two run blast. The A's pounded out 13 hits on the night and were led by Brad Young's 4x4 (3B, RBI, 2 Runs). Kurt Zagzebsk 2x5 (2B, 3 RBI's), Dan Shea 2x4 (HR, 2B, 3 RBI's) and Austin Sarauer 2x3 (HR, 2B, 3 RBI's) all were key contributors on the evening.

Brownsville halts A's winning streak at 16

August 12th - The Kewaskum A's dropped a 3-1 game to perennial thorn-in-their-side Brownsville on Sunday afternoon, handing the A's their first loss of the Rock River season (14-1, 34-8 overall). Game highlights were few and far between for the A's as they mustered only one sustained scoring opportunity all game. With the game scoreless in the 5th, Kurt Zagzebski led off with a double down the left field line. Jason Strobel followed with a bloop single to center to put runners on the corners for Austin Sarauer, who came through with a RBI single. Brad Boegel followed with a well placed bloop single to load the bases, but a pop-out to the infield, and a double play ended the A's threat.

The A's clung to this lead into the 7th as starting pitcher Jim Ziegler battled to keep the Brownsville off the board. Brownsville was able to break through in the 7th though as a two-out RBI single through the right side tied this game at 1-1. After a quiet top of the 8th for Kewaskum, Brownsville took the lead for good with a two-out 2 RBI double to go up 3-1. The A's put a runner on in the 9th thanks to a Brownsville error, but went down quietly after that to see their 16 game winning streak come to an end.

The A's return to the field tonight as they travel to Horicon for a Rock River makeup game. Then on Tuesday the A's head to West Bend to take on 7up for the much anticipated SWABA championship game. The A's then kick off the Rock River playoffs on Saturday as they host Madison Laurel Tavern and on Sunday they travel to Watertown for their second playoff game (both games are at 1:30pm).

A's take home Tri-County Championship

August 7th - The Kewaskum A's took home the 2012 Tri-County Night League championship with a 10-3 win over Brookfield on Tuesday night. Brookfield jumped ahead with three 1st inning runs, but the A's quickly responded with five runs of their own in the bottom of the 1st to turn the tides in their favor. Ty Schill led off the bottom of the 1st with a great at bat that resulted in a leadoff double and Brad Young followed with a double of his own to score Schill. Kurt Zagzebski (RBI single) and Brad Boegel (2 RBI single) followed later in the inning with run scoring hits, and Adam Sarauer capped the 1st inning scoring with a RBI sacrifice fly.

From there Brad Young settled in on the mound and pitched nearly flawlessly the rest of the way. He would end up picking up the win tossing 8 innings (3 ER's, 5 Hits, 4 BB's, HBP, 8 K's), while Jake Panzer tossed a scoreless 9th. The A's pounded out 16 hits for the game and were led by Jason Strobel's 5x5 (2 2B's, 3 RBI's) night. It was the third time in the last four games where a Kewaskum batter finished with at least 5 hits. Kurt Zagzebski 3x5 (RBI) and Brad Boegel 3x5 (2B, 2 RBI's) had solid nights at the plate as well.

A's come out swinging in 13-6 win over Hartford

August 5th - The Kewaskum A's moved a step closer to wrapping up the #1 overall seed in the Rock River playoffs with a 13-6 win over Hartford on Sunday afternoon. The A's jumped ahead 8-0 after two innings and never really looked back from there. Jake Spaeth led the 19 hit attack going 6x6 (2B, RBI), while Jason Strobel 3x6 (2B, RBI) and Dan Shea 3x5 (3 RBI's) had solid days at the plate. Kurt Zagzebski, Brad Young, and Brad Boegel all finished with two hits as well. Lucas Kopeschka (5.2 IP, 5ER, 6 Hits, 3 BB's, 2 K's) picked up the win on the mound, while Jake Panzer (2.1 IP, ER, Hit, BB) and Brad Boegel (IP, 2 Hits) finished out the game in relief for the A's. The win moves the A's to 14-0 in the Rock River League (33-7 overall) and with a win Thursday night at Horicon, the A's can wrap up the #1 overall seed in the Rock River playoffs.

The A's will also take on Brookfield this week, on Wednesday night in West Bend (7:30pm), for the Tri-County Night League Championship. On Sunday (August 12th) the A's will travel to Brownsville for their last Rock River regular season game and then on Tuesday (August 14th) the A's will travel to West Bend to take on West Bend 7up for the SWABA Class 'A' Championship game. Both teams have won their respective divisions in their regular leagues so this should be a great match-up as both teams prepare for their upcoming playoffs.

A's advance to Tri-County Championship

August 1st - The Kewaskum A's fought off a tough Oconomowoc Five-O's team by a score of 5-3 Wednesday night to advance to the Tri-County Championship game. Oconomowoc got things going right away offensively as they used

four 1st inning singles to jump out to a quick 2-0 lead off A's starter Jim Ziegler. The A's were able to get a run back in the 2nd when an Austin Sarauer double brought in Jason Strobel to make it 2-1.

The A's were at it again in the 3rd inning when Alex Nuelk reached by a hit-by-pitch and Ty Schill followed with a single to right. A's clinch Rock River North Title with 8-1 win over Horicon

July 31st - The Kewaskum A's locked up the Rock River Northern Division Title with a 8-1 win over Horicon on Tuesday night. Horicon used three 1st inning hits to go up 1-0, but it was all Kewaskum after that as Brad Young (Win, 8IP, 4 Hits, 12K's) and Tate Schill (IP, 2 K's) combined to allow just one hit the rest of the way. The A's went up for good in the 2nd innning when Brad Boegel and Kevin Gonring connected on back-to-back RBI singles.

Kewaskum then made it 3-1 in the 3rd as Jason Strobel stayed hot at the plate ripping a RBI double to right center. The score would remain here until the 7th when the A's tacked on a run from a Horicon error and busted the game open with Austin Sarauer's pinch-hit 2 RBI double to make it 6-1. The A's pounded out 18 hits for the game and were led by Kurt Zagzebski's 5x5 (RBI) night. Jason Strobel, Brad Young, Alex Nuelk, Brad Boegel, and Kevin Gonring all finished with two hits for the game.

A's top Slinger again on Sunday

July 29th - The Kewaskum A's clinched a share of the Rock River Northern Division Title with a 4-0 win over Slinger on Sunday afternoon. The A's jumped out to a quick 1-0 lead on a Dan Shea RBI single in the 1st and had the bases loaded with nobody out. However a strike out and a double play ended the inning without any further damage, as this ended up being a sign of things to come offensively for the A's on Sunday. Fortunately it would not matter as A's pitchers dominated all day long yielding just two hits. Jake Panzer threw 6 scoreless innings to pick up the win, while Brad Boegel tossed a perfect 3 innings for the save.

Jason Strobel remained hot at the plate as he blasted a homer in the 6th to push the lead to 3-0. He finished the day 2x3 (2B, HR, RBI). A's lock up Rock River playoff berth

July 28th - The Kewaskum A's wrapped a spot in the upcoming Rock River playoffs with a 12-2 (7 innings) win over Slinger on Saturday afternoon. Lucas Kopeschka picked up the complete game win (7IP, 2ER, 7 Hits, BB, 9 K's), while Brad Boegel 3x5 (HR, RBI, 3 Run's) and Dan Shea 2x5 (RBI) led the way offensively. The A's raced ahead 2-0 in the 1st as Ty Schill scored the first run of the game on a balk, while Jason Strobel later drove in Kurt Zagzebski with a double down the third base line.

A's remain unbeaten in Rock with 7-2 win over Rubicon

July 22nd - The Kewaskum A's picked up a big 7-2 win over Rubicon on Sunday afternoon in Kewaskum to move to 10-0 in the Rock River League (28-7 overall). A shaky start by Kewaskum allowed Rubicon to go up 1-0 in the top of the 1st, but the A's responded back in the 2nd when Jason Strobel connected on his fourth home run of the year to tie the game at 1-1. The A's went ahead for good in the 4th as Steve Ketter delivered with a two-out RBI single. Alex

Nuelk followed with a walk, setting the table for Ty Schill who ripped a RBI single to score another run. On the play though, Nuelk and Schill both came around to score on throwing errors to give the A's a 5-1 lead.

Rubicon responded right back by loading the bases in the top of the 5th with nobody out, but A's starter, Jim Ziegler, was able to get the next three batters in order as a sacrifice fly plated the only run in the inning. In the bottom half of the 5th, Brad Young led off the inning with a single bringing up Austin Sarauer who belted a two-run homer to put the score at 7-2.
