A's Rocky Season Comes to a Close

August 12th - The rocky 2015 season for the A's to a close on Wednesday night as they fell to the Pewaukee Muskies by an 11-2 score. Despite a very young starting lineup, the A's hung with the powerful Muskies through four innings. In the 5th inning though, the wheels began to fall off as miscues on defense opened the way to a big four run inning. Pewaukee never looked back from there as they cruised to the easy win.

The A's were led by Blake Fleischman and Jim Ziegler at the plate as each chipped in with two hits on the night. Jordan Dreikosen (5IP, 6 Hits, 5 ER, 6 K's) suffered the loss on the mound, but if not for a few defensive miscues would have finished with a much better pitching line. The A's finish the year at 20-25 and will look to patch some glaring holes as they head into the 2016 season.

Loss to Hustisford Keeps A's Out of the Rock River Playoffs

August 9th - Despite having a very inconsistent year, the A's still found themselves in position to qualify for the Rock River playoffs with a win over Hustisford on Sunday afternoon. Unfortunately the A's could not capitalize on this opportunity and suffered a 6-3 loss to the Astros ending any chance of playing in this year's Rock River playoffs.

Hustisford took the early lead in this one pushing across a single run in the top of the 1st, but the A's answered with a two run homer off the bat of Austin Sarauer to quickly retake a 2-1 lead. The score remained here until the 3rd inning when Hustisford erupted for 4 runs to take control of the game. The A's on the other hand could not muster much offense until the 9th when they pushed across a single run to cut the score to 6-3. In what was a microcosm of the A's season, they were able to load the bases in the 9th with nobody out and could not push across any additional runs even with the heart of their order up. Ty Schill led the A's offensively with a 3x4 day at the plate, while Jordan Kuczynski finished with two hits. Jim Ziegler suffered the complete game loss on the mound.

Win Over Oakfield Set up Showdown with Hustisford

August 8th - With the A's Rock River playoff hopes on life support they traveled to Oakfield on Saturday afternoon, and grinded out an ugly 8-4 win over the hosts Oaks.. The win sets up a showdown Sunday in Kewaskum against Hustisford with the winner clinching the final playoff spot in the Rock River playoffs. In Saturday's game the A's grabbed an early 1-0 lead as Brad Young scored on a wild pitch in the 1st inning (one of three times the A's would score via a wild pitch on the day).

The A's added to their lead in the 4th as Austin Sarauer blasted a two run homer and Joe Stubbe added a RBI double to give the A's a 5-0 lead. In what was a reoccuring theme on the day though, the A's left the bases loaded in the inning failing to come up with the hit that would bust the game wide open. All in all, the A's would strand 20 guys on base on the day and had to hang on for dear life as Oakfield kept the game close to the bitter end.

Brad Young gave the A's a gutty performance on the mound as he picked up the win throwing all nine innings (4ER, 8 Hits, 7 BB's, 4 K's) while Joe Stubbe led the way offensively going 3x6 (2B, RBI). Jake Spaeth, Adam Sarauer, Nick Rosenthal and Ty Schill all chipped in with two hits apiece.

A's Running Out of Chances After Loss to Hartford

Despite the loss, the A's still control their own playoff destinty...wins against Oakfield and Hustisford this coming weekend and they are in the playoffs. Jim Ziegler (5IP, 5 ER) suffered the loss on the mound, while Jake Spaeth 2x3 (2B) led the way offensively. Joe Stubbe finished the night with a double at the plate as well.

A's Playoff Hopes Fading After Loss to Juneau

August 2nd - The Kewaskum A's dropped a disappointing 7-6 Rock River League game to Juneau on Sunday afternoon, putting their playoff hopes in serious jeopardy. Juneau took an early 2-0 lead in the 3rd inning on the first of their three home runs on the day. The A's responded with a big four run bottom of the inning to regain the lead though. Adam Sarauer (RBI single), Joe Stubbe (2 RBI single) and Randy Finger (RBI double) all had run scoring hits in the inning.

Juneau regained the lead in the 5th on a solo home run, but the A's again answered back in the 6th with two runs of their own to take a 6-5 lead. Tony Gonring and Mike Prochnow each delivered with RBI singles in the inning, but three consecutive outs with the bases loaded kept the A's from cashing in on a bigger inning. Sarauer knocked in the A's first run of the night on a bases loaded sacrifice fly in the 2nd inning, and Kurt Zagzebski followed with a two RBI double to give the A's an early 3-0 lead.

Slinger pushed across their lone run in the 5th inning, but Austin Sarauer put the game out of reach in the 6th inning with a towering three run homer.
