A's Well Represented on Rock River All-League Team

November 5th - The Kewaskum A's had three members take home All-League honors at Saturday night's Rock River League Banquet held in Hustisford. Jason Strobel (390 Avg, 30 Hits, 20 Runs, 7 2B's, 3 HR's, 17 RBI's) was named to the Rock River North All-League team as an outfielder, while Mike Aiello (.322 Avg, 19 Hits, 15 Runs, 5 2B's, 2 HR's, 20 RBI's) was selected as a Catcher. Also receiving honors was Teddy Miller who was selected as the Scorekeeper of the Year.

Strobel also took home the prestigious Player of Merit award given to one player each year who has exemplified great character on and off the field. This puts a cap on what was a nice rebound season for the A's who took some time finding their way, but eventually won 13 out of 14 games before dropping their last two games of the season. The A's finished the year 24-15 and were eliminated in the first round of the Rock River playoffs.



Teddy Miller Inducted into the Rock River Hall of Fame

October 22nd - Teddy Miller, longtime scorekeeper for the Kewaskum A's, was recently inducted into the Rock River Hall of Fame as a member of the 2016 induction class. Miller becomes the first member from the Kewaskum franchise to receive this presigious honor joining 234 other members in the Rock River Hall of Fame. For those who have played with and supported Kewaskum over the years, it is only fitting to see Teddy receive this honor after his 53 years with the team.



Season Comes to an end at Brownsville

August 13th - The A's saw their 2016 season come to an abrupt end on Saturday afternoon as their long-time rival the Brownsville 49ers eliminated them from the Rock River playoffs by a 10-0 score. Brownsville raced ahead to a 4-0 lead after one inning and cruised from there. Untimely errors again haunted the A's in this one as they finished the day with four errors which led to all ten runs being unearned. Jake Spaeth and Nick Rosenthal led the A's offensively as they each collected a double, while Jason Strobel wrapped up his stellar A's career with a 1x4 day.

The A's ended their season with two disappointing games, but finished the year with an overall record of 24-15 (13-7 Rock River League) and returned to the Rock River playoffs after a one year hiatus. Injuries and player absences plagued the A's early on, but the team eventually hit their stride winning 13 of 14 games over a four week stretch starting in mid-July to early August as a core group of players began to emerge. As a result the A's head into the offseason with plenty to be excited about in 2017.

A's Crushed by Pewaukee

August 10th - The Kewaskum A's saw their nine game winning streak come to an end on Wednesday night as they were blasted by the Pewaukee Muskies by a 14-0 score in 6 innings. Pewaukee erupted for five runs in the top of the 1st inning and never looked back from there. The A's collected just one hit on the night, an Adam Sarauer single, and were horrendous on defense committing five errors. The A's finished the SEWBL regular season with a respectable 4-5 record finishing tied for 3rd place in the six team league.

Kewaskum Beats Plymouth in Regular Season Finale

August 7th - The A's continued to play well as they topped the Plymouth Flames by a 5-2 score on Sunday in Fan Appreciation Day at Kiwanis Park. Adam Sarauer (RBI single) and Randy Finger (RBI double) put the A's ahead 2-1 after one complete inning. The A's extended this early lead to 5-1 in the 3rd as Randy Finger delivered a 2 RBI single and Mike Prochnow drove in another run. The trio of Jim Zlegler (5IP, 0 ER, 5 K's), Andy Neu (2IP, ER) and Brad Young (2IP, K) made this early lead hold up the rest of the way as the A's capped the Rock River regular season with a win. Mike Aiello (2 2B's), Adam Sarauer (RBI) and Randy Finger (3 RBI's) all finished with two hits on the day.

The A's will now host rival Brownsville this coming Saturday (August 13th at 1:30pm) in a wild card game for the Rock River Playoffs.
