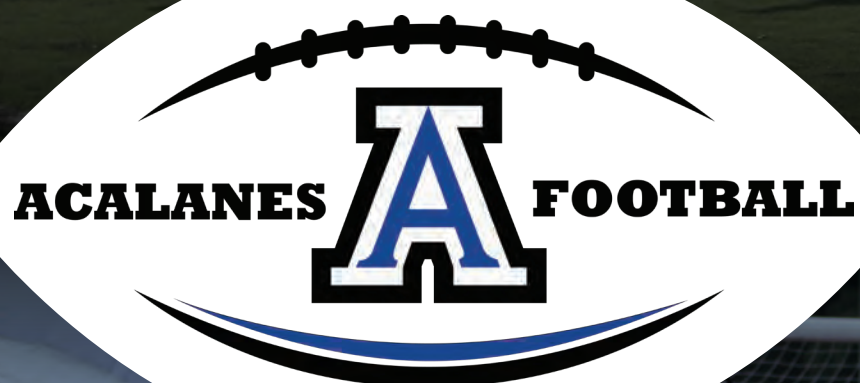

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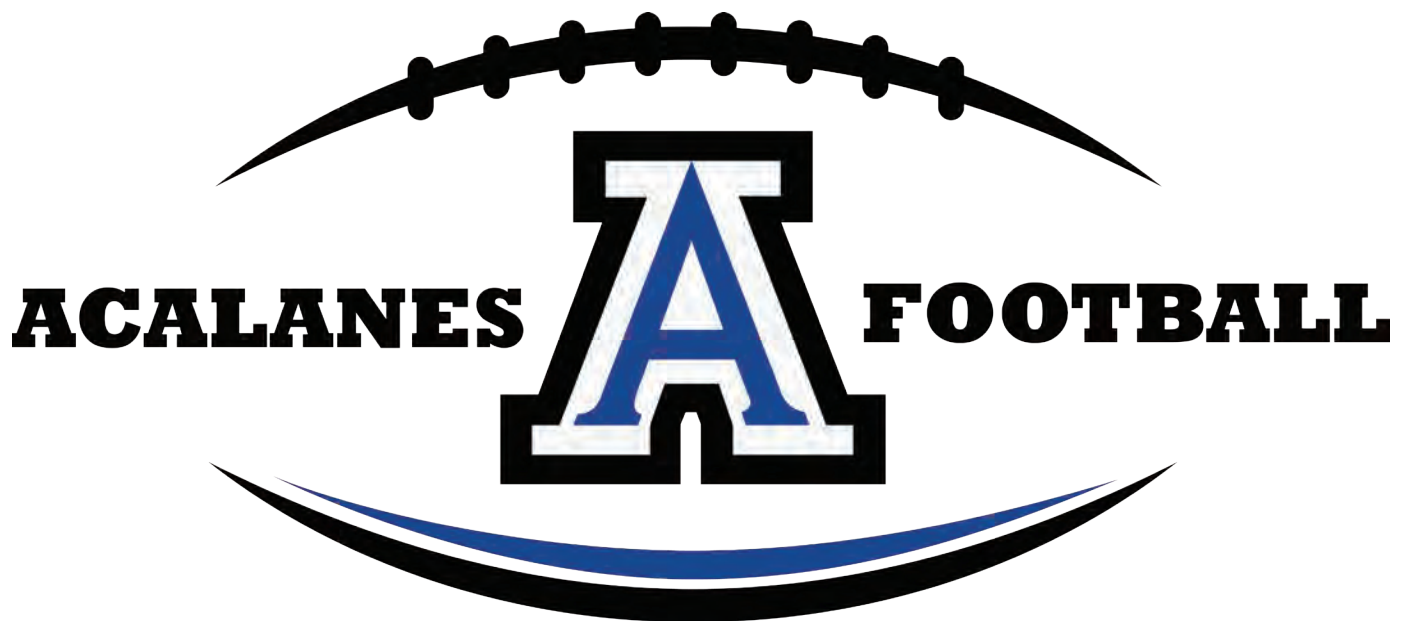

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RE-BUILDING THE ACALANES DONS FOOTBALL PROGRAM

Energy. Optimism. Drive. When Coach Floyd Burnsed steps onto our field, these are some of the most obvious impacts he brings to the rejuvenated Acalanes Dons Football Program. It's like nothing I have ever seen.

Coach Burnsed has been hugely successful in unifying all of the key stakeholders – the players and their families, the cheerleaders, the faculty, the school band, the student body, alumni, the media, and the entire community of Lafayette. Everyone is pulling in the same direction. His vision has caught like wildfire, and it's paying dividends.

Though he has lived in the Bay Area for three and a half decades, Floyd Burnsed still has a calm, unmistakable Florida drawl. It's one of his hallmarks. That, and, of course, the ability to win football games.

THE JOURNEY TO ACALANES

In a stunning and impressive Bay Area hire, Burnsed returned to high school football last year to rebuild the Acalanes Dons Football Program. "Coaching does keep you young," he says. Burnsed discussed the Acalanes opportunity with his wife Carolyn, who was supportive of the move. "We decided it was fun when we were involved with high school football, so I took the job," he said. They now reside in Vallejo.

"When I interviewed over here, I had tons of people calling me,

wanting me to take the job (at Acalanes). I have a lot of those ex-Miramonte players that live in Lafayette now that were calling me with their support. I was amazed at how much support there is in this community. Acalanes has been very good in other sports, especially baseball and aquatics. But in football, they have struggled over the years. It's going to be fun to try to turn a program around and have success. It will be a challenge as well."

While at Miramonte, his teams made the NCS playoffs in each of Burnsed's last 10 years. His players featured big linemen – sometimes in the range of 6 and a half feet, 285-pound range. The rosters were always deep, typically numbering in the 70s. "That's what we want to build here," said Burnsed, whose current team has 44 players. "That is not something that's going to be done in a few months; but, I think if people see the way we play football, the schemes we run, and that we play fun and exciting football, we can build on that."

Burnsed left the high school ranks in late 2001, capping his 20-year run at Miramonte by coaching the Matadors to their second 13-0 season during his run, their fifth NCS title season under his guidance and fourth in five years. After brining Miramonte to the top after 20 years, Coach Burnsed took on a new challenge at Solano Community College rebuilding a very successful college program known for preparing players to elevate their football careers to the D1 college level.

Burnsed's name is synonymous with quarterback success. Including Ivy Leaguers, 13 of his Miramonte quarterbacks went on to play at the NCAA Division I level. That string began in 1984 with John Andrews, who went to Yale. Others followed, including Mark Guilion (Miami, then Alabama), Drew Bennett (UCLA) and Ken Dorsey (Miami).

Burnsed had incredible success at Miramonte, compiling a 154-62-2 record while winning 10 league championships. He was named Contra Costa County Coach of the Year three times; 1983 Champion Coach of the Year; the San Francisco 49ers' Coach of the Year in 1996; and the North Coast Section Coach of the Year in 2000.

Given the number of players Burnsed has coached over the years, it is not surprising to see things come full circle. Four of Burnsed's assistants are his former players: running backs coach Bryce Hawthorne from Solano, quarterback coach Peter Hess from Miramonte, defensive backs coach Mark Vicencio, and wide receiver coach Kurt Piper.

OFF AND RUNNING

So far, the building process at Acalanes is off to a great start. The varsity team has a 6-0 record, yielding wins over Alhambra (Martinez), Suncoast (Florida), Rodriguez (Fairfield), San Marin (Novato), DeAnza (El Sobrante), and Concord.

The JV football team is also 6-0, and the freshman are off to a 6-1 start. Acalanes has never had a season in which all three teams were this dominant through the first half of the season.

Burnsed has good material to work with in quarterbacks. Senior Robby Rowell has completed 61 percent of his passes for 1,399



yards, carried the ball 32 times for 157 yards (and a combined 26 touchdowns), all while only playing half of five (of our six) games. Burnsed points to Rowell's leadership and smarts. "It's a perfect fit for the situation," he said. "Burnsed's primary offense is built around the spread offense at Acalanes, which is a great match for a QB like Rowell and his very capable wide receivers."

Additionally, sophomore QB Nick Kresnak is getting lots of playing time. The Dons feature four different primary receivers — Brian Merken, Aidan Macnamara, Nick Price and Chris Rogers — with a combined 1,402 yards receiving and 29 touchdowns. Merken leads the team with 23 catches for 629 yards and 12 trips to the end zone.

Coach Burnsed made a calculated decision to bring up three sophomores to Varsity this season to contribute and invest into the future of the Dons football program. Jake Delaney (running back and kickoff return) has contributed 365 all-purpose yards and 4 TDs; Tommy Thrasher (tight end) has 10 catches for 164 yards and two TDs, and Nick Kresnak (quarterback) has thrown 25 completions for 423 yards and five touchdowns. Not too bad for three guys who don't even have their drivers licenses yet!

NEW TRADITIONS

Coach Burnsed started a new tradition last year by bringing the entire football program (including incoming freshman) to Lake Tahoe for a week-long camp that brings all the players and coaches together for a unique bonding experience. There, they have the ability to compete against other teams from different parts of the country while uniting as a team and developing lasting friendships. The players and coaches have said they will remember this experience for the rest of their lives.

Another one of his unique programs is the "Mom's Chalk Talk" where he invites all of the players mothers (through the Acalanes Touchdown Club) to come to the school and learn more about the Acalanes Dons football schemes. He brings all of the moms to the field to learn their son's football position, giving them a real-life understanding of what is required of their son while on the field. It has been something over the last two years that many of the moms said was the highlight of the season.

In addition, members of the Touchdown Club are invited to attend the "Chalk Talks with Coach Burnsed" and his team of coaches. There, they learn about the various offense and defense schemes that the program runs in different scenarios and talk about the strategy that goes into the planning for upcoming games — as well as during game time.

"Unlike at the college level or NFL level, you can't go out and get your players — so you play with what's there," Burnsed said. "Any high school's classes go up and down, so you have good classes and other classes that aren't very talented, and you have to make the most of what you have every year. That's part of the fun of high school coaching."

This season, Coach Burnsed and his talented team of coaches brought the Varsity and JV teams to play football against two teams from Florida and New Jersey (similar to the college players' experiences when attending a Bowl Game). There were many off-field activities as well, such as Walt Disney World's Epcot theme park — a big attraction when choosing Florida as the location for the trip. The team even played at the ESPN Wide World of Sports Complex (also at the resort), and attended a three-hour physics lab, one of Disney World's offered educational courses.

Despite all the fun they had, the team didn't have much time off. Three hours of Thursday, Friday, and Monday were devoted to football, as well as the games on Saturday. Burnsed believed the Varsity game especially boosted team morale.

"The way the game ended really gave our team a lot of confidence because we won it on a goal line stand, and all the players went nuts," Burnsed said. A goal line stand is a play or series of plays when the defense stops the offense on the goal line.

While the main focus was playing football, Burnsed also emphasized strengthening the team's connection. According to Burnsed, many players do not get the opportunity for such a trip unless they end up going to a major college and playing in a bowl game.

"This is more than just going out of state and playing a football game," he said. "It's a whole experience because all of the things we got to do over there."

The parents that attended all came home understanding Coach Burnsed's vision to build an outstanding football program in Lamorinda. This was an incredible experience for the entire program, and an experience that the players will remember for the rest of their lives.

Everyone is looking forward to the second half of the season as league play began last week. We are all very grateful that Coach Burnsed has joined the Acalanes Dons community and we are all excited to be part of something great! GO DONS!!!!

FLOYD BURNSSED

VARSITY HEAD COACH & OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR

Floyd Burnsed is half way through his second season as the Dons head coach and is returning to Lamorinda having coached the Miramonte Matadors from 1982-2000. He then left for the college ranks and built the Solano CC program from the ground up. This will be his 40th season coaching football.

Burnsed's coaching career began in 1974 at Russellville High in Kentucky, where he served as the offensive coordinator. He became the offensive coordinator at Lamar High in Houston in 1979 before taking the job at Miramonte in 1982, where he established himself as one of the top high school coaches in the nation by compiling a 154-62-2 record while winning 10 league championships and four North Coast Section championships.

Burnsed was named Contra Costa County "Coach of the Year" three times, 1983 Champion "Coach of the Year", the San Francisco 49ers 1996 "Coach of the Year" and the North Coast Section "Coach of the Year" in 2000.

Burnsed is known for being one of the best quarterback coaches in the nation. He has coached eight quarterbacks who have signed with NCAA programs in his twenty seasons at Miramonte.

He has a master's degree from Western Kentucky University (1976). He and his wife, Carolyn, reside in Vallejo with their two Australian Shepherds, Cody and Sadie.



DAVID ORTEGA

LB COACH & DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR

Coach David Ortega has been around the game since his playing days. He coached linebackers at the University of California in 1996 and has held positions within the football staff from 1993-2005 (Recruiting Coordinator & Academic Coordinator) at Cal. He also coached for two years with the Walnut Creek Marauders (2008 & 2009) as well as helped coach the freshman defense at Miramonte HS in 2015. Ortega is the University of California's all-time leading tackler, finishing his career with 525 stops. He also ranked in the school's top ten with 8 interceptions (3 vs. Oregon in 1987). He started four consecutive seasons for Cal, moving into starting line-up in fourth game of his redshirt-freshman season in 1986 and staying there through 1989. Ortega was named honorable mention All-American in 1987-89. He was also named second team All-Pac-10 as sophomore and junior in 1987 & 1988 and was a first team Pac-10 selection as senior in '89 after making 159 tackles, an average of 14.5 stops a game. David played in East-West Shrine Game in '90 and signed free agent pro contract with L.A. Rams. Coach Ortega and his wife, Teresa, have three children David, Gabrielle, and Julia.



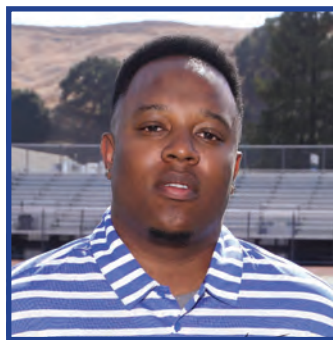
BRYCE HAWTHORNE

He then moved on to play for the University of Nebraska-Omaha in 2009. Bryce then transferred to play for the Wayne State Wildcats where he led the team in all rushing categories and received All-NSIC Honorable Mentions.

Bryce is from Vallejo where he attended Vallejo HS and he played varsity football and earned

Roman is in his 11th year of coaching football. Prior to joining Acalanes in 2016 Roman coached four seasons at Vallejo High School.

He currently works at Oakley as retail store manager in Vacaville. Outside of work and coaching, he spends time

The Matadors were voted 1983 California State Champions after beating Newman who were 23-0 over two seasons coming into the NCS Championship.

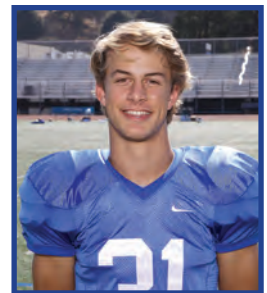
