

Head Coach Juan de la Rocha

Juan de la Rocha begins his 17th season behind the Plainsman bench and will coach his 400th game this year. As Head Coach, de la Rocha has grown "Shen" Varsity Hockey into one of the top

programs in all of Section II, guiding the Plainsmen to 2 Final Four appearances, 2 Regional Championships, 7 Section II Division I Championships, 7 CDHSHL Championships and 9 Suburban Council Division Titles. In addition, Coach D's Plainsmen have made 11 Section II Final appearances during his 16 year tenure with an overall record of 258-117-20.

In 2016-17, the team had an impressive surge during the second half of the schedule. de la Rocha & his staff guided the Plainsmen to 11 wins of its last 12 games to earn another trip to the Section II Final at Union College. Unfortunately, the team lost in 3OT after 5 lead changes in the contest.

In 2013-14, the team captured its 7th Section II Title under de la Rocha's direction (9th overall) and finished the season ranked #7 in NYS. The Plainsmen have also been ranked in the Top 10 of New York State High School hockey teams by the New York State Sportswriters Association for 9 of the last 16 years. One of de la Rocha's most successful seasons came in 2004-5 season where the Plainsmen posted 24 wins, tied for the highest total in the program's history. During the time he was collecting his con-



secutive Section II titles, de la Rocha was also selected to coach the boys' hockey team representing the Adirondack region at the Empire State Games in 2007, in Westchester County.

Over the span of 16 years, "Coach D" has posted five 20-plus victory seasons, making him one of the winningest coaches in Section II. During the 2012-2013 season de la Rocha earned his 200th win in a 5-2 victory over Shaker/Colonie. He currently stands among the top 15 active coaches in NYS for most wins. His overall winning percentage of 65.32% and his impressive 75% winning percentage at Sectionals is only one reason why he has been named Times Union "Coach of the Year" three times and Saratogian "Coach of the Year" four times.

A 6th grade Physical Education teacher at Gowana Middle School, de la Rocha was also Assistant Coach for the Boys'Varsity Soccer team from 2001-2006. The team won 3 Section II titles, 2 Regional titles and a State Championship in 2005.

As a former soccer goalkeeper, de la Rocha was a member of the NCAA Division I Men's Soccer team during his freshman and sophomore years at Syracuse University. He was also a member of the ACHA, Division I Club Hockey team all 4 years, holding both "Assistant Captain" and "Leading Scorer" titles in his senior year. As a youth, de la Rocha was voted Schenectady High School "Athlete of the Year" in 1993. He lettered in both soccer and lacrosse as a goaltender, but it was as a forward in hockey that he left his mark. He played for Niskayuna/Schenectady High School from 1989-1993 where, once again, he was Captain and Leading Scorer in his senior year. His high school success led him to do a 1993-4 post graduate year at Avon Old Farms School, where he played both Varsity Hockey and Soccer.

Coach de la Rocha holds a Bachelor's Degree in Physical Education, with a minor in Coaching (Syracuse University), and a Masters Degree in Education, as well as Certification to be a School District Administrator (MCLA). He also holds a Level 3 USA Hockey Coaching Certification. He and his wife, Dena Marie, live in Clifton Park with their two children, Christina (13) and Joseph (10). -written by Judy Fraizer

Prior to coaching at Shen, Coach Louis played Division III hockey at SUNY Cortland, where he earned his Bachelor of Science degree in Education. He played for 4 years, his senior year as captain of the team, racking up 19 goals and 29 assists in 105 games, for a total of 48 points. He had been recruited for the Red Dragons while playing 2 years of Junior "A" hockey for the locally based Capital District Selects team. Coach Louis is, himself, a "Shen" graduate (1998) and played "the best game on earth" for the High School Varsity team for 3 years, while in 9th – 11th grade. A self-confirmed "rink rat", he has been hanging out at Clifton Park Ice Arena ever since it opened.

For 16 years Coach Louis had been on staff with Excel Hockey Schools. He had also served as an evaluator and a member of the selection committee for the



Empire State Games, Adirondack Region, for 2 years. Coach Louis is also the Junior Varsity Golf Coach for Shen, with a current record of 39-0 and three JV championships in three years. He is in his 13th year of teaching physical education in the Shenendehowa Central School District and is currently at Orenda Elementary School.

Coach Louis resides in Ballston Lake with his wife, Holly; son, Kyle (10); daughter, Brynn (7); and chocolate lab, Maci. In the off-season he enjoys spending time with his family & friends and loves to play golf.
