- All four regional teams had, what I would call, successful seasons. The primary goal of all programs is to give the players in our region a chance to complete at the hightest level in the province. Not only are they doing that, but in many cases are having terrific success. The region conducted online surveys of the players and parents for all programs and were able to receive feedback which should help us move forward to improving all programs. 56% of the eligible players/families responded.

Vice-Director (Female Rep) Cal Harrison gave the following report from Myles Cathcart, Head Coach

The Yellowhead Chiefs AAA Female Midget program showed a very good improvement during the season. The team only had 3 top aged players with the majority of the team comprised of 1st year players. The girls progressed during the year to qualify for the playoffs. We finished with an overall record of 14 wins, 28 losses, 9 ties. The league was scheduled with 28 games and we participated in 4 exhibition games, four Showcase Tournaments (Minnesota, Central Plans, Melville and Westman).

During the Showcase tournaments a number of our players have been identified by NCAA and Canadian Universities. We provide each tournament with an information package with academic information. Tirra Lemoine also played for U-18 Team Manitoba capturing a silver medal. Our goal of the program is to promote the regional players to the next level.

The coaching staff would like to thank the Yellowhead Region for supporting female hockey and the development of female players within the region.

Vice-Director Harrison thanked Myles Cathcart, Derek Tibbats and Bill Brown of the AAA Female Midget Team; and Laura Cowling, Jim Cooke and Bruce Coulter of the AAA Female Bantam team.

- Buy a bunch of "Property of The Yellowhead Chiefs" T-shirts for all 12 and under.
- Mandatory participation in Development Squads to be eligible for Director's Cup

 - Consideration given to new residents
- Extended Season programs available up to Peewee Minor
- Attracting Coaches was a challenge this year

2012/13 Pee Wee Development Program report - submitted by Mark Wotton

In our first year of the program held in Foxwarren on Mondays we had 33 palyers enrol with 5 of those players being goalies. We had players from Birtle, Strathclair, Hamiota, Shoal Lake, Elkhorn, Foxwarren, Neepawa and Minnedosa. A mock try-out was held on Nov. 12th as we told the players only 20 of the were going to make the cut. I wanted the players to get some experience in trying out to make a team as it is a different feeling. A few days aftr the try-out every player was split into two groups keeping car pooling and

positions in mind. I decided that each group would practice every second Monday starting on Nov 19th and run the practices thru February. Each group was to have 13 ice session, be we had to cancel two of them due to the weather so there ended up being 11 session each with 3 session being inter-quad games with scores being 2-1, 5-4 and 7-4. practices ran for an hour and half and consisted of different drills focusing on proper technique and positioning as well as some high paced thinking drills. Regardless of the drills the biggest benefit for the players practising together was just being able to compete against their peers and be challenged by them which in turn challenges themselves.
