TCSF nets 7 all-staters

TRAVERSE CITY — An even 10 area players appear on the Michigan High School Tennis Coaches Association's all-state teams unveiled Sunday.

Traverse City St. Francis has seven of those 10.

Traverse City Central's Hayden McNamara is a Division 1 honorable mention choice, with Petoskey's doubles

team of Cooper Self and Gunnar McNamara an honorable mention pick in Division 3.

The big haul came in Division 4, with the Gladiators putting three singles players and two doubles teams on the first-team all-state team after a third-place finish in the state finals.

St. Francis had first-team selections in singles players Andrew Gerling, Elliott Bandrowski and Nathan Sodini. The doubles teams of Brendan

Chouinard and Adam Chittle and Jack Kleinrichert and Sean Navin also took first-team honors.

Gerling posted a 31-5 record at No. 1 singles this season, while Bandrowski was 33-5 at No. 2 singles and Sodini 37-3 at No. 3. Sodini wrapped up his prep

career with a mark of 131-35.

The doubles pairings own slightly different records because of lineup changes, with Chouinard (39-6) and Chittle (38-7) at No. 1 doubles and Kleinrichert (38-4) and Navin (41-4) at No. 2 doubles.

Self and Gunnar McNamara advanced to the Division 3 quarterfinals after a bye and a 6-1, 6-4 win over Trenton.

St. Francis' Alex Thelen and Tyler Tafelsky were state champions at No. 4 doubles after a 38-3 season record, but came up short of making the all-state team despite only dropping one match against a Division 4 foe the entire year.
