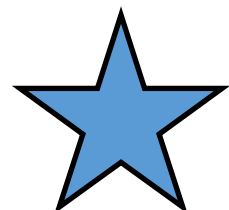

Michigan Volleyball Coaches Association MIVCA

The Michigan Volleyball Coaches Association has been busy the past several months. Our new website (mivca.net) has many new features and an updated look. By offering school memberships, we have more than doubled our membership to nearly 1200 members, which includes school and club coaches at all levels, retired coaches, ADs, officials and others. We renewed our agreement with Baden for the next five years to be the official ball used at MIVCA events, and have an agreement with Adidas to outfit our athletes at the Senior All-Star Match.

MIVCA honors coaches (COTY), former coaches (HOF) and others who have helped promote volleyball (Special Recognition Award), Teams (All-Academic), and Athletes (Ms Volleyball, All-Academic, All-Region/All-State, Senior All-Star Matches, grants and scholarships). The varsity coach must be a MIVCA member for any of these awards. Several Michigan coaches and athletes have also received national honors in the past year from our AVCA and MHSCA/NHSCA affiliations.

The 2018 MIVCA clinic was held in March at Harper Creek HS and featured Michigan native and 2016 Olym-

pics bronze medalist, Alisha Glass Childress as our lead clinician, with several other Michigan college and high school coaches presenting sessions. This year's Hall of Fame honoree was Louis Mitchell who has coached at Renaissance HS for 29 years and is President and founder of the Detroit Volleyball Coaches Association. The Special Recognition Award was given to Robert King for his 40+ years of supporting Clinton volleyball. The four State Champion, Final Four, and All-Region Coaches of the Year were also recognized.

The 2018 All-Star Matches, sponsored by Adidas/T-shirts Printing Plus, will be held at

Harper Creek HS on July 13. Approximately 70 senior athletes and 32 coaches have been invited to participate, and undergraduate 1st Team All-state players and grant and scholarship winners are honored between matches. There will also be a "Pass on the Passion" youth clinic offered during the day allowing for interaction between our All-star athletes and coaches and aspiring young athletes.

MHSFCA/MIAAA PLAYOFF PROPOSAL VOTED DOWN

With a 9-7 vote the Representative Council of the Michigan High School Athletic Association (MHSAA) voted down a proposal to alter the current football playoff system. The proposal was written and endorsed jointly by the MHSFCA and the Michigan Interscholastic Athletic Administrators' Association (MIAAA) with the expressed purpose of solving the problems in scheduling games caused by the current automatic qualifier playoff system (i.e., 6 wins and you're in).

This proposal was written by a joint committee of MHSFCA and MIAAA leadership, along with input from the MHSAA staff. It started with the most recent proposal that was voted down, and alterations to playoff point values and bonus point values were made to address concerns brought up by conferences with members with wide enrollment diversity. Many

thanks to Andrew Pratley (Holland) and Greg Vaughan (Traverse City West) for their work on this project!!

The finalized proposal was approved, nearly unanimously, by the MHSFCA Board of Directors. Once this was done, a full educational push aimed at coaches and athletic directors was executed. The MHSAA Football Committee then approved the proposal by a 19-2 vote, followed by 83% approval by the MIAAA.

Though we are disappointed by the Rep Council's vote, we remain steadfast that change is coming, as the support for it exists in both the coaching and administration communities.

15/20/25/30/35/40/45/50 YEAR COACHING SERVICE AWARD

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

- The candidate must have distinguished himself/herself with good coaching ethics and promoted good sportsmanship throughout his/her coaching career. *The AD or principal's signature confirms this.
- Ten (10) years of coaching outside of the state of Michigan may be applied to the application.
- Coaching at any level may be applied as long as it is a school sponsored interscholastic sport. A maximum of ten (10) years may be allowed for coaching at the collegiate level.
- To receive a general coaching certificate the candidate must have been coaching at least one sport per year at any level for the requested number of years.
- To receive specific certificates for a single sport the candidate must qualify for the specified number of years in that sport. This can be at any level. You cannot however count more than one level or season for a sport in any one year. For example, coaching both boys and girls basketball during the same school year counts as "1" year; coaching both 7th grade boys and JV boys during the same school year counts as "1" year.

Awards for 30 years and more will have the sports that the candidate coached listed on the plaque. The coach will be presented only one award for each level of service after 30 years.

The MHSCA Distinguished Service Award does not need to be awarded each year. This award should be bestowed only when the MHSCA Board of Directors committee decides that nominations warrant presentation of the award. This award may be given posthumously.

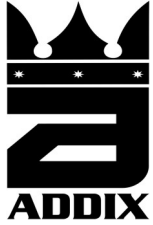
