## NORTHWOOD GIRLS, WOODBRIDGE **BOYS SHINE AT PCL FINALS**

The Northwood High girls cross country team and Woodbridge boys squad were ready to bounce back at the Pacific Coast League Finals on Nov. 1 at Irvine Regional Park in Orange.

Both teams were defeated by Corona del Mar at the first league cluster meet of the season three weeks ago at Mason Park in Irvine.

But that didn't happen this time around.

The Northwood girls ran one of their best team races of the season to come out on top and capture another league title.

Northwood won the girls title with 40 points, placing its five scoring runners in the top 13.

Corona del Mar finished second with 55 points and Beckman and University tied for third with 84 points. Beckman won the tiebreaker and will move on to the CIF prelims based on the finish of the sixth runner. It is the Beckman girls team's first ever trip to CIF.

But it was Northwood that ruled the day and Chloe Muller led the way.

Muller pulled away from the lead pack with just under a mile to go and won the three-mile race in 17:16.

Northwood also got strong finishes from Micaela O'Connell, who was seventh in 18:18, Mary King, who placed eighth in 18:19, Jazmin Esparza, who was 11th in 18:25, and Sasaiya Robles, who came in 13th in 18:38

Beckman got a strong finish from its runners to earn a CIF berth. The Patriots were in fourth place as a team with a mile left, but turned it on at the end.
