11. It is the captain's responsibility to make his players aware of all the policies and rules of the game and of this facility prior to the start of the season.

12. Medical/Health Insurance is the responsibility of each participant to provide for his/himself. There is always

a certain amount of risk involved when participating in any limited contact sport.

13. Any player on the roster without a hold-harmless registration form submitted and a photo identification card obtained by the team's final game of the season, will be ineligible for "Play" during the playoffs!

14. At the first game of the season the team captain must submit a fully executed team statistic sheet. Which will be used for individual stats. Any captain failing to submit this sheet prior to game 1 will eliminate his team from participation in the record keeping process. Player numbers on the stat sheets must match those on the score sheets or no credit will be given for individual achievements.

SCHEDULING OF GAMES

15. All team will play an equal amount of Saturday and Sunday games between 8am - 4pm. Teams will also play an equal amount of weeknight 11:00pm games. Note: The amount of games may vary each season and the captain will be informed of the amount at the captain's meeting.

16. Two scheduling conflicts will be accepted at the captain's meeting. Management will attempt to schedule around your conflicts. In the event this can't be done, each team will be affected once before any team is

affected twice.

17. No game changes will be permitted after the captain's meeting. The captain is responsible to inform management of any conflicting days and dates at the captain's meeting.

18. Conflicts given at a captain's meeting do not apply to rescheduled games or playoffs.

19. If management makes a scheduling error, the game will be rescheduled if we are given 10 days notice prior to the date of the game.

20. Due to sudden changes in the weather, games can be cancelled at any time. Players can call one hour prior to game time to find out about cancellations and no information will be available until that time.

21. It is the team captain's responsibility to find out when games are rescheduled to when they have been cancelled. If a team does not show up for a rescheduled game, they will forfeit the game and there will be no re-rescheduling.

MANDATORY EQUIPMENT

22. Each player must have:

- a) Matching shirts with an 8" PERMANENT number on the back, no taped on numbers.
- b) Mylec shin pads worn outside sweats. Shins must be intact or will be considered illegal.
- c) Hockey helmets with full cage or shield unaltered in any manner.

d) Elbow pads.

e) Gloves with no cut-outs (dekhockey or ice hockey gloves recommended).

f) Sneakers.

g) Mylec plastic bladed hockey stick with butt-end (Except for pink and orange blades). No graphite, aluminum or ice hockey sticks allowed.

h) Protective cup.

i) Goaltenders must wear a face mask with a helmet or back skull plate, goalie pads, chest protector and protective cup. All other equipment is optional but must conform to rules 8b,11a,b,c,d,e.

23. Players wearing duplicate or taped on numbers will be ejected from the game and will only be able to re-

enter the game if he obtains a legal jersey.

24. If any player loses his helmet (including goalie) and cage during play, that player must immediately leave the surface and go to the bench or immediately put the helmet back on without continuing play. Failure to exercise one of these options will lead to a minor penalty.

25. A minor penalty will also be assessed to any player with 2 sticks (Meaning possession of 2 sticks). The only exception to this rule is that the player may hand a goalie stick back to the goalie as long as the player

holding the two sticks does not enter play.
