It was through Emmons that the Chieftains' program took off. 11/2017 Lenny Emmons on how he recruited players:

The other Masco sports varsity team coaches required the boys to have their hair cut short. Emmons had long hair himself. He made it clear that you didn't have to cut your hair short to play on the soccer team. As a result he got more boys to play soccer. In addition he scouted out and recruited the best athletes from the other Masco sports to play soccer.

Masconomet's first-year team surprised everyone by compiling an excellent 7-2-3 record. Of the starting eleven, seven were seniors. They were led by tri-captains Jeff MacGill, who was the team's starting goaltender, Chip Ackerman, who piloted the defense, and John Small, who led the scoring attack with his fine playmaking and shooting. After their first two losses, Masco went on to win or tie their next ten games with help from seniors Dan McCraine, who was superior on the line, and Steve Cox, who was considered one of the best defensive players in the league. Much consideration and thanks should go to Coach Dave Balser who, in his first year of coaching, did a great job.

SOCCER

The 1975 soccer season started with grueling double sessions one week before school opened, and with Masco's fourth Cape Ann League title in the same amount of years. Right from the start, it was general knowledge that it would be another successful and fun season. Masco's 12-0-2 league record placed the team in fifth place in the State for Division I. The team then moved on to the state preliminary competition against a good Framingham North team, winning 2-1 on Pete Tyson's goals. The season ended at Stonehill College in Easton, Mass. Masco lost to Braintree 3-0. Outstanding Performers: Dan Bergsten, Mark Agnew, Erik Schmakel, and Craig Hancock made all Cape Ann League. Tom Shaughnessy and Peter Tyson made All West (along with the others). Erik Schmakel lead the league with 28 points (22 goals and 6 assists); Craig Hancock was in second with 27 points (14 goals and 13 assists).

The Masconomet Regional High School boys' soccer team has...

Nov. 16, 1983 --TOPSFIELD, Mass. -- The Masconomet Regional High School boys' soccer team has been barred from playing out the season after team members reportedly celebrated a playoff victory by dousing each other with champagne.

The regional school committee unanimously voted to end the season because the players violated school rules prohibiting alcohol use.

The incident was not related to the recent suspension of a football player and soccer player when they failed to pass a breathalyzer test after a fistfight Nov. 5.

The soccer team incident occurred two days earlier, when a champagne bottle reportedly appeared on the field after Masconomet beat North Andover, clinching the Cape Anne League championship for the third straight year.

The school board's decision came one day before the team's final game in the division playoffs. A victory in that game would have placed Masconomet in the playoffs for the state championship.

One player originally was to be disciplined, but the regional school board decided Monday to terminate the season -- a move which has won the support of many parents.

A team spokesman, senior Gary Balentine, said Tuesday the soccer team apologized for causing 'a very fine school to suffer unneeded embarrassment.'

He said the soccer players agree that their actions were 'improper,' but they never intended to drink the champagne.

'The champagne was used as a beverage to be shaken, squirted and poured over our heads, not to be drunk,' Balentine said.

He said the team felt the school board's decision was 'an overreaction and injustice.'

The parents of the soccer players issued a statement saying teachers, administrators and families 'must work together to prevent sending mixed messages to the students about the use of alcohol by minors.'

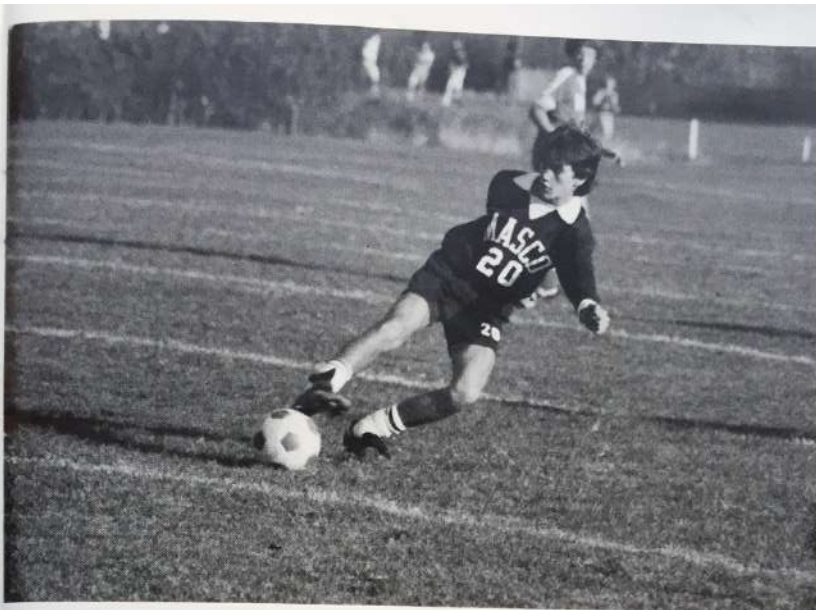
