**If North Andover and Masconomet should meet only once in a year, it might as well be for hardware.**

If North Andover and Masconomet should meet only once in a year, it might as well be for hardware.

That certainly was the case on the night of Nov. 11, 2013, Veteran's Day. The hardware that day ended up in the hands of the Masconomet Chieftains. They defeated the Scarlet Knights of North Andover, 2-1, for the Division 2 North title.

That win also gave Masconomet a berth in the Division 2 state final game against Walpole on Thursday night at 7 p.m. at Lynn's Manning Field.

"It was a lot of fun [making the state final in 2011], and hopefully we'll get it done this year," said Masconomet's Kevin Gilbert, who hammered home the game-winner with 12 minutes remaining in the game. "I was a freshman that year. I'm looking forward to the state final, I've had it in the back of my head since then."

Gilbert was awarded an indirect free kick from 48 yards out, on the left side of the field. He raised his hand, alerting his teammates to start mixing it up for a deflection in via header or kick. Neither was needed, as Gilbert essentially kicked a 48-yard line drive to the back of the North Andover net.

"I was expecting someone to touch it. I think there was a lot of confusion in the box, and it just snuck through," said Gilbert. "It was a pretty routine kick."

"Kevin does a great job of putting balls into the box for us, he just lines them in," said Masconomet head coach Dave Mitchell. "On that play, we were trying to get a little flick, but we didn't need it. Jeff [Panella] came across in front of the box, but Kevin did a great job."

Masconomet is 22-1-1 going into Thursday's state championship game, with North Andover closing up shop at 21-1. Yes, the Scarlet Knights' only loss was that North title game. North Andover head coach Kyle Woods felt terrible for his 2013 team to be coming away without a first place trophy.

"It's incredible, [21 wins] is an incredible feat, something that probably won't happen again," said Woods. "Maybe it will, but if I ever do win this North title or, God-willing, a state title, I'll always remember this team. I'm going to try to get one for these guys."

North Andover's Michael Skarbelis, a threat all year for the Scarlet Knights, was the last foot of many Scarlet Knights' feet to touch the ball in a scrum as North Andover "willed the ball in" (in Woods' words) for their only goal. That came just 58 seconds into the second half.

“It seemed like everyone at one point or another had their foot on it,” said Woods. “There were so many people inside the box. I saw the ball go into the net and that’s all I could see.”

Masconomet started the scoring in the game in the first minute and change. Gilbert made a textbook throw-in into the box, where Panella headed it to Edison Forbes, who put the finishing touch for a 1-0 lead that stood through the rest of the first half.

Masconomet’s Mitchell, for one, was not surprised at all to see the game tied or one goal apart throughout. This was neither the time nor place nor competition for a rout.

“When you get to this level, there are no weak spots anywhere. My hat’s off to North Andover. They came in 21-0 and gave us all we could handle. That’s what Masco/North Andover is all about,” he said.

From the history of coaches Bill Tarbox (North Andover) and Len Emmons (Masconomet) battling it out for nearly three decades to Woods’ and Mitchell’s teams leaving it all on the field for a North trophy, it doesn’t get much better for North Shore high school soccer.

“North Andover is always a quality club and we’re always a quality club. We preseason scrimmaged this year, and it was the first time in 40-odd years we hadn’t played each other [in the regular season] up until today. They’re worthy competition. My guys were looking forward to this, as I’m sure they were on the other end.”

“It’s a tough way to have your first loss, but Masco’s a great team,” added Woods. “They play really well, really physical. They’re huge – I thought we were playing their basketball team for a minute. It was a typical Masco/North Andover game.

“It reminded me nothing of our preseason scrimmage,” Woods said. “It was very intense. Both teams were at their best.”

Now, they go in two very different directions. North Andover had to bid farewell – as they do every year – to a slew of talented seniors, 19 on the varsity roster to be exact.

“The whole program went undefeated – freshman, JV and varsity – so we’ll take it one day at a time and I think we’ll be alright next year,” said Woods.



Masconomet has two days of practice to prepare for the penultimate game of its season. Walpole was a Cinderella team in Division 2 South this year, the 13th seed entering at 9-7-2. They beat Greater New Bedford, Nauset Regional, Pembroke and No. 2 seed Oliver Ames in the South final, shutting out each of those teams.

Mitchell said the team will continue to work on improving what they already do.

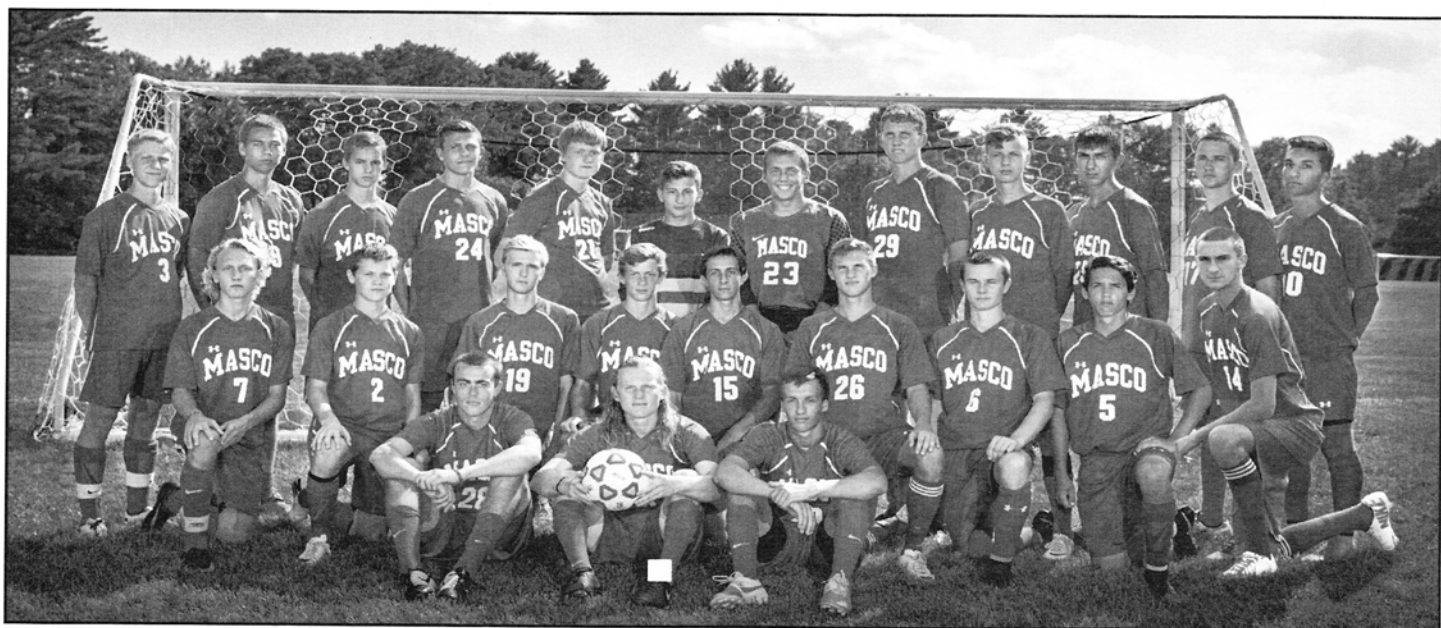
“We might throw in a couple wrinkles on free kicks and work on set pieces, but we’ve been playing good, quality soccer,” he added. “We want to stick with what’s gotten us to this point.”

# Masconomet Boys Soccer Team Thriving Under New Head Coach Scarpaci

Jared Scarpaci has made a massive impact on Masconomet boys soccer as the new head coach so far this season.

Over the off-season, the team was shocked when David Mitchell stepped down as head coach only two years after a state championship and a year after a second straight state tournament appearance.

When Scarpaci stepped into the head coaching spot, players rejoiced. Scarpaci was formerly the athletic director at Masconomet, before taking a leave to coach the men's soccer team at Emerson College.

During his time at Emerson, Scarpaci led that team to the most single season wins in Emerson history, as well as producing 31 all-conference players over his 13 years as the head coach at Emerson.

The Masconomet soccer program has been flourishing since Len Emmons took over in 1972, becoming the third most awarded coach in Massachusetts High School soccer history, winning an impressive 576 games.

Emmons was then replaced by former coach Dave Mitchell, who had an impressive 76-9-7 record during his time at Masconomet.

Scarpaci looks to continue the winning ways of Masconomet as well as cement his own legacy. His 2015 team was 10-3-2 overall, and 10-0-2 in Cape Ann League play as of Oct. 14.

The Masconomet boys also look to cement a legacy and avenge a short playoff run last year.

“Going far in the playoffs is all about being able to compete with the best teams and players in the state. We feel by training and competing with each other we are getting the preparation we need to face elite teams in the playoffs. We push ourselves and our teammates to be better than the day before, every day,” said senior Anthony Tzortzis.

The players in the Masconomet program look to Scarpaci to continue their tradition of excellence.

“There are more adjustments mid-game based on how we are playing, and the play of the other team. We have become more dynamic and played more formations that we haven’t played before,” said Tzortzis.

Scarpaci also had a crisis to deal with, upon his arrival to Masconomet, when senior goalie and captain Steven Heintzelman tore his meniscus.

“Players get injured, it’s a part of the game. Obviously it isn’t a favorable situation, but our goalies are great so we could easily plug someone in,” said Scarpaci. The team has stayed strong in net, thanks to the play of not one, not two, but three goalkeepers – Ryan Manning, Derek Davidson and Enrico Caserta.

Any time a team experiences a coaching change, all leaders are drastically affected.

“[The coaching change] has given me a new way of seeing things from a different perspective. I have focused on being an uplifting presence with my teammates and giving us the best attitude to win,” said Heintzelman.

The team as a whole has made massive strides in the season already, almost completely switching all aspects of play, which has caused a huge surge of confidence for Scarpaci from a fan and faculty perspective.

Scarpaci looks to bring the dynamics of athletics at the college level to Masconomet.

Masconomet's depth in the roster has given Scarpaci various weapons to work with, including goal scorers such as senior Blaise Romanowski and a massive defensive presence out of senior Alex Spaulding.

Overall, the Chieftains and Scarpaci look to have a great season this year and continue their renowned winning ways.



# H.S. BOYS SOCCER: Oliver Ames basks in winning a state title

Oliver Ames captured its first state title in program history on Saturday and will have to say goodbye to the seniors who led the Tigers there, while also looking at what underclassmen will step up next season.

The Oliver Ames High boys soccer team was a part of history on Saturday.

For the first time in the program's history, the Tigers captured a state title as they defeated Masconomet, 3-1, in the Division 2 final.

"We know we won it, but I don't think it has really set in as to how big of a moment it is for these young men on their soccer journey," said Oliver Ames head coach John Barata. "It's something that they will realize soon. This is not something everybody gets to do. It's very, very few people get to do it."

The journey to a state championship wasn't easy for Oliver Ames, which finished the season with an 18-0-3 record.

The Tigers survived a first-round scare against Milton, pulling out a 1-0 win. Then in the quarterfinal round of the South Sectional, the OA was pushed to the brink by Hingham, but came out on top, 3-2, in double overtime with senior Chris Romero notching the game-winning goal.

In the South Sectional final, Oliver Ames went to double overtime again, but the result was the same, winning 2-1, as sophomore Nathaniel Cardoza put the Tigers in the state final.

When Masconomet went ahead, 1-0, in the 12th minute with a state championship on the line, Oliver Ames didn't panic and scored three straight goals to take home the win.

Behind all the postseason drama, was a strong senior class – led by three captains in Romero, Keegan Nutt and Max Bamford – making sure the ship steered straight in times of duress.

“All the seniors were excellent,” Barata said. “We had three senior captains that were outstanding. Terrific leadership, tremendous grit and just a never-give-up attitude, which clearly presented itself three times to us this tournament. We were down in three games and our captains and our senior leadership, on the bench, off the bench, are really what kept us alive and it kept us pumping. They were the heart to the whole team and the heart of the whole program.”

The Tigers now have to say goodbye to the 12 seniors who were on the roster.

The two most notable departures come from Nutt and Romero, who were two of the top players in the Hockomock League this past season and were named Eastern Mass. All-Stars.

Oliver Ames will also have to replace the entire back line consisting of seniors Jared Mallers, Max Ahearn and Bamford. The trio anchored a stellar defensive unit, which allowed only 12 goals the entire season.

“Obviously on the field we'll miss them,” Barata said. “But more importantly we're going to miss them as friends, as colleagues and as pioneers for the program.”

Even though there are players to replace, the Tigers have several underclassmen who looked poised to fill the void.

Cardoza, who was named a Hockomock League All-Star, could see a much a bigger role next season after putting together a sensational sophomore campaign.

Junior forward Thomas McCormick will return as the team's leading scorer with the absence of Nutt and Romero.

Goalkeeper Jack Carroll headlines a very strong sophomore class along with Cam Vella, Matt Alvarado, Tylor Jones, Mason Galbato, Jack Sheldon, James Gillespie and Sean McFarland, who could all make an impact.

And after winning its first state championship, next season will bring something new to Oliver Ames, a title defense.

"We have the potential to have a good enough team that we might be able to have another successful season," Barata said. "Will we ever replicate this season? This could happen once in a lifetime. That's not the goal. The goal is, can we be competitive again? I think we will be there again. I think we can compete again next year."

Junior and two year varsity player Michael Budrewicz, commenting on the season, spoke about the season, the team, and the state final game. # Masconomet, Nauset advance to Div. 2 boys soccer state final

Masconomet is trying to rewrite the script after falling in the Division 2 state final last season.

The No. 4 Chieftains took a big step toward achieving that goal, rolling to a 4-0 victory over third-seeded Beverly (18-2-2) last night at Manning Field in Lynn, making them Div. 2 North champs for the third time in four seasons.

Masco (21-2-1) grabbed early momentum when Austin Dziadosz drilled a loose ball into the back of the net in the 15th minute.

"This late in the year it's about capitalizing on the opportunities," said Chieftains coach Jared Scarpaci. "You're not going to get many of them against the better teams."

Masco dented the scoreboard again in the 37th minute when Bryan Gilbert snuck one past Beverly goalie Conner Cadematori for a 2-0 lead.

Gilbert notched his second goal early in the second half on a solo rush up the left sideline, flying past a Beverly defender and rifling a shot off the post and in for a 3-0 edge.

"He is one of the, if not the, best player in the state," said Scarpaci. "He scores, and he scores in big games ... he's quick within 10 yards but if you give him 30 yards he can pick up an enormous amount of speed, and he's got great footwork on top of it."

Mike Budrewicz added a late goal to polish off the impressive win.

"We've set our goals to be a top team in the state, it says something about our guys, only eight players are returning, and the new guys have really bought in," Scarpaci said. "It's nice to be back in that game."

Masconomet will face Nauset in the Div. 2 state final.

The Nauset Regional (North Eastham, Mass.) boys soccer team finished off its perfect season with a 23-0 record and a Division 2 state championship.

But then consider this: Nauset entered the state final against Masconomet Regional (Boxford) having outscored the opposition 106-0 on the season. Again, yes, zero.

If nothing else, Masconomet can say it became the first — and only — team to score on Nauset, when Michael Budrewicz connected with 26 minutes left in the first half to tie the score at 1-1.

Nauset is ranked No. 7 in the USA TODAY Sports/National Soccer Coaches Association of America Super 25 for fall boys soccer.

“We thought about maybe calling a timeout, but we didn’t,” coach James McCully told The Boston Globe. “We thought, ‘Let’s let it play itself out . . . let’s see how good we are now.’ ”

The answer was really good. While the game settled through the end of the first half and into the early part of the second half, James McCully (the coach’s son) scored from the left side of the box with 29 minutes to play.

That set the final margin and would eventually lead to Nauset’s first state title since 1979.

McCully scored both of his team’s goals to finish with 38, one shy of his father’s school record.

# Masconomet falls to Arlington in Division 2 North semifinals

The Division 2 North semifinal of the state tournament is where the road ends for the powerhouse boys soccer program in Masconomet.

The boys took a 2-0 loss on Friday against Arlington at Manning Field in Lynn.

Arlington did not overwhelm Masco with their shots at all. In fact, the two goals were not emphatic, to say the least.

The first came from an over-the-head flick from Declan Dolan. The second came off a header from Will Clifford off a rebound assist from teammate Perry Sofis-Scheft.

With only 10 shots (four on target), Arlington made a Masco defense look a whole lot different on the scoreboard than actuality.

"I'm the guy that possesses and sends it down to the wide backs. Against this team I just couldn't do that," said junior captain Lloyd Cleary "This game was a bit harder, but we got the job done."

Cleary commanded the midfield, going after 50/50 balls against a very technically sound Masco team.

Masco would bring the ball up but find no success in their usual break style offense. The Chieftains only sent three shots on the net. Which is an incredible marginal difference compared to the numbers customary of Mike Budrewicz and his teammates.

"Their defense was really good," said an emotional Budrewicz post game. "It was weird. We just couldn't get the shot off today. I don't know. It was just a really weird day today."

There were a couple moments where it looked like Masco had a chance to crack their defense. One near-goal was called back on a very close offside call. The second was practically a goal line save that kept the Arlington clean sheet with three minutes left in the game.

"The formation they played doesn't allow a lot of penetration," said Masco head coach Jared Scarpaci. "We talked about the things we have to do to beat that. We didn't execute it well enough and there you have it."

Scarpaci and his boys shouldn't keep their heads down after a terrific season. The boys with a combination of flair and speed put up an overall record of 17-4-1. They were one of the final four teams in Division 2 North, and they maintained their reputation of being one of the best teams in the state.

"I think I've done a good job being a leader from the past couple years," said Budrewicz. "I hope they take tips from what I've been doing and just grow from this."

With a group of strong leaders and captains, this team will certainly be back with strength in 2018. The boys will be led by Connor Fitzgerald in the back as the only captain until additional captains are assigned next season.

# Boys Soccer: Masco has a well-balanced attack

A pair of early season setbacks to St. John's Prep and North Andover seems to be a distant memory for Jared Scarpaci and the Masconomet Regional boys varsity soccer team, which is cruising into the final two weeks of the season with a lot of momentum.

That momentum, which the team currently possess, is due to its impressive offense, which is led by Josh Rubin, who has located the back of his opponents' cage at least 20 times this season.

But Rubin isn't the only one producing for the Chieftains. Its players like Aedan Salvador, Matt Dzwil, Devin Ralph and Harry Kessel, who are also netting goals on offense, which has helped the Red and White outscore opponents, 60-8, as of late Monday afternoon.



“What is a little different about this team than other teams in the past is that we have other guys like Aedan Salvador and Matt Dzwil and Devin Ralph, who are putting in goals for us. And they’re all seniors, too,” said Scarpaci.

“To have half your team as a real offensive threat that if given the opportunity can finish then that is a nice piece to the puzzle.”

From a quick glance at the team’s recent outcomes, finishing on the offensive end doesn’t seem to be a problem for Scarpaci’s crew, which has netted at least four goals or more in their last five outings – they netted five goals in back-to-back contests earlier this month against Lynnfield and Ipswich, as well as on Monday during the team’s 5-1 win over Georgetown.

And while the offense has certainly received some attention from members of the Cape Ann League (CAL), the same could be said for the Chieftains’ defense, which has limited its last five opponents to a combined three goals in 12 halves.

The Masconomet defense has been led most recently by goalie Zach Rock, who Scarpaci considers a great netminder, but also Connor Fitzgerald, who is the team’s center back.

“Connor has done a great job for us (on defense), and so has Will Neuenhaus, who is a sophomore, along with Dom Gecoya and Harry Warshafsky,” said Scarpaci.

“It’s been a strong defense and they have figured out how to work together, which is part of it and what they still need to work on, which they have figured out well, but still need to do a little bit better, which is win the ball and then distribute the ball. And that is the key for (discovering) what is a good defender versus a great defender. (They must) win it and then get it to your team.”

Getting the ball to this particular offense shouldn’t be an issue, but luckily the backline does have some time to improve its play over the next few weeks before the Chieftains embark on a postseason journey, which they hope will extend beyond the MIAA D2 North semifinals.

Last season, the Chieftains secured the second seed in the 14-team sectional, but managed to win just one game – they beat Danvers, 2-1, in overtime in the quarterfinals – before falling to Arlington in the semifinals.

The loss certainly has inspired the players to play their best soccer this fall, but the hope is both its offense and defense will gain additional momentum over the next few days, which will make the Red and White a tough team to knockout of the state tournament.

"(Losing to Arlington) remains on the mind of the players," Scarpaci said of his team's postseason setback last fall.

"It was a real interesting game for us. They clearly won and they were the better team that day, no question at all. And you know, we look back and I remember saying to the guys, 'you know, we didn't play bad, we just didn't play well enough.' It wasn't like we did anything that was bad. We played okay, we played okay, but we just didn't play well enough to win ... we just didn't play well enough to win and that was a very good Arlington team."

Arlington would eventually go onto lose to Concord-Carlisle in the sectional finals – the game needed penalty kicks to determine a winner.

Arlington is not on the team's remaining schedule – they could meet Masconomet again in this year's tournament, pending the seeding and where they land on the tournament tree – but one team that happens to be is Gloucester, a non-conference squad that should provide Scarpaci and his staff with a better understanding of what they must do to be successful in the postseason.

"We had a little hole in our schedule this year and Gloucester was kind enough to take us up on it, so I am interested in what they can bring to the table and what we can bring to the table when we play against them," said Scarpaci. "The Northeastern Conference is a strong conference, it is a different animal than the CAL in a lot of ways, so I am excited to see what that's all about when the time comes."

# MASCONOMET TAKES DOWN LYNNFIELD IN BATTLE OF CAL CONTENDERS

LYNNFIELD — The Lynnfield boys soccer team (7-1) just couldn't catch a break against Masconomet (8-2) Monday afternoon Pioneer Stadium. Both teams came into the game tied at the top of the Cape Ann League Kinney Division standings with identical 7-0 division records.

But in the end, it was the Chieftains who walked away with a 5-1 victory.

The game was up for grabs with 25 minutes to go with Masco holding a slim 1-0 margin on Aeden Salvatore's goal in the ninth minute. It was still a one-goal game with 19 minutes to play after Jack Cleary scored on a header to cut the deficit to 2-1, but the Chieftains exploded for three goals over the next nine minutes, pouncing on a couple costly Pioneer mistakes, to put the game away.

"We have not played a team like this that is so good up front and their transition game really hurt us," said Lynnfield coach Brent Munroe. "They got us twice in transition after we made mistakes, but the way they pushed the speed of the game was something we had not seen before. But I bet we probably had more shots on them in this one game than all of the other Cape Ann

League teams combined, so we had our chances, we just kind of let them take control of the game in the second half.”

While Masco’s Josh Rubin carried the offense, scoring the middle-three goals that put the game out of reach, it was an unlikely contribution from a bench player that made the difference.

“When our starting keeper Michael Duest got hurt in the first half, we had to go to our backup, Zach Rock, and he played just an incredible game for us, making all those great saves for us,” said Masconomet coach Jared Scarpaci. “He was the guy who kept them off the board today. The final score was not at all indicative of how close this game was. Lynnfield pressured us and forced Zach to make some saves to keep us in the game.”

Lynnfield got off to a strong start and had the ball in the offensive zone for a good part of the first seven minutes, but the Chieftains struck first, scoring on a counterattack with 31:25 to go in the first half. Salvatore made a slick move to evade a Pioneer defender, then drilled a low shot from the top of the box into the corner past Pioneer goalkeeper Jack Campbell.

Masco carried the 1-0 lead into halftime, then doubled the lead to 2-0 in the 54th minute when Rubin capitalized on a Pioneer defensive turnover. A minute before, Jonathan Luders had put a through ball on the foot of Nathan Bass just outside the box, but the Chieftains broke up the play and turned on the jets in transition, then beat a Pioneer defender at midfield. Campbell came off his line to dive for the ball, but the ball squirted loose right to Rubin, who drilled it low into the open net.

Lynnfield fought back and drew a free kick at the 25 after Tommy Buston was decked. Luders’ kick was played into the box to Cleary, who had just entered the game. Cleary drilled a shot on goal, but Rock picked the ball out of the air, bicycle-kick style to make a miraculous save. A couple of minutes later, Luders got flattened and was awarded a free kick at the 45-yard line. Luders hooked the shot to the 10, where Cleary headed the ball into the back of the net to slice Masco’s lead to 2-1 with 18 minutes left.

That was as good as it got for the Pioneers, however, as Masco scored three unanswered goals to seal the victory.

Munroe could only wonder what might have been had a couple of things gone their way.

“I thought we were right in it,” Munroe said. “Our best chance was on that free kick at the 6-yard line that got blocked, then we were a little unlucky that they came back and beat us in transition and scored their second goal. We had a couple of chances to break up that play at midfield, but couldn’t and that really cost us.”

# Arlington High boys soccer captures Div. 2 North championship

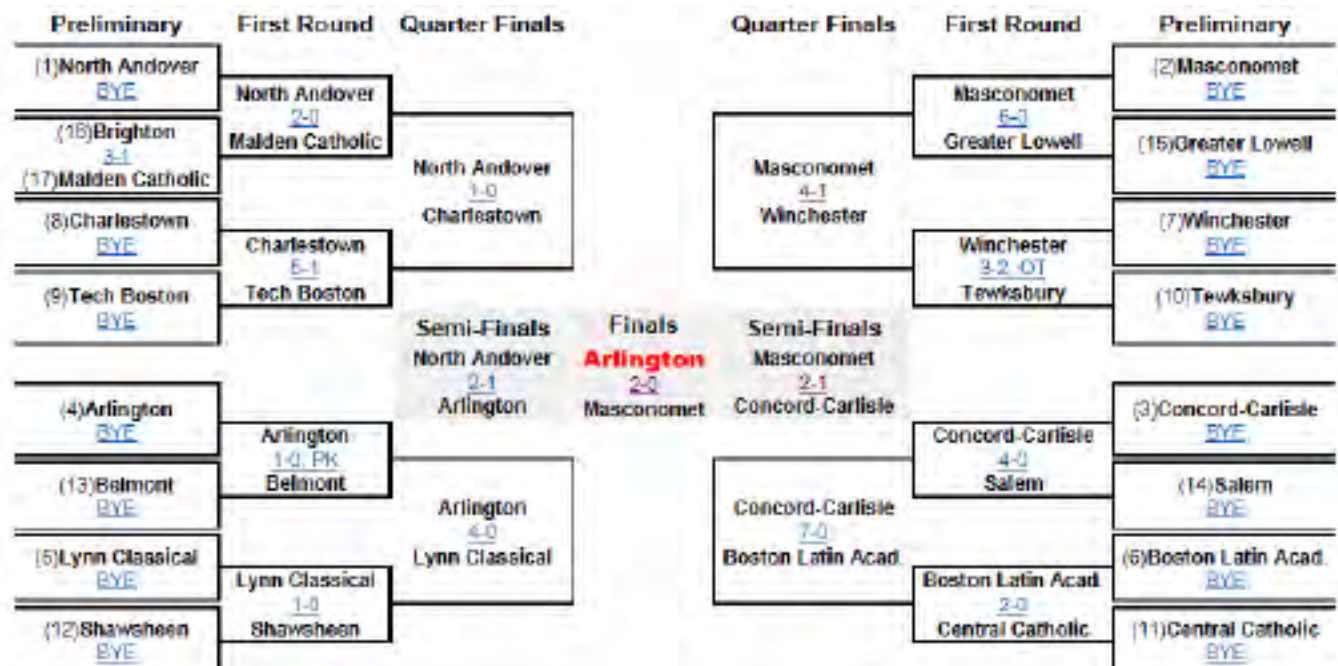
